GAME 6: ALABAMA (6-0, 3-0 SEC) vs. SOUTH CAROLINA (5-1, 2-1 SEC) SATURDAY, OCT. 17 • 6:45 P.M. • ESPN BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM (92,012) • TUSCALOOSA, ALA.

THE GAME: The second-ranked University of Alabama football team begins a three-game Southeastern Conference homestand with a visit from the No. 22 South Carolina Gamecocks, on Saturday, Oct. 17, at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The game is scheduled to kick off at 6:45 p.m. on ESPN with Brad Nessler, Todd Blackledge and Erin Andrews calling the action. Eli Gold, Phil Savage and Barry Krauss will have the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN: Alabama head coach Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his third season with the Crimson Tide. He was named the school's 27th head coach on January 3, 2007. Saban has compiled a 116-50-1 (.698) record as a collegiate head coach with a 25-8 (.758) mark at Alabama that includes a 6-0 record this year with a 3-0 mark in the SEC. He captured his 100th career win and coached his 150th game as a collegiate head coach during the 2008 campaign. In 2003, Saban led LSU to a 13-1 record and the BCS National Championship. Overall, Saban has coached three conference championship teams (1990 Mid-American, 2001 SEC and 2003 SEC) and nine of his 12 teams have played in post-season bowl games with Tide appearing in the 2009 Sugar Bowl. Saban is one of two (Bob Stoops) current Football Bowl Subdivision coaches to coach for at least 10 years and not suffer a losing season.

RANKINGS: Alabama was ranked fifth in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches' preseason polls. It was the highest preseason ranking for the Tide since the 2000 season when they opened at No. 3. Since the preseason poll, the Tide moved to No. 4 after the opening weekend with an Oklahoma loss and then to No. 3 in week three when Southern California fell at Washington. The Tide moved up to No. 2, jumping Texas, in the AP poll after a 22-3 win at No. 20 Mississippi in week six. The Tide stayed at No. 3 in the coaches poll. UA garnered a season-high 10 first-place votes in the AP poll and five in the coaches poll. The Gamecocks are ranked 22nd in both the AP and USA Today coaches polls.

SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES: Alabama leads the series with South Carolina, 11-2. The two teams have not met since the Crimson Tide posted a 37-14 win over the Gamecocks on Sept. 17, 2005, at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia. In the last meeting at Bryant-Denny Stadium, South Carolina posted a 20-3 win over the Crimson Tide on Sept. 18, 2004. Alabama holds an 8-1 series lead in games played in the state of Alabama, including a 7-1 mark in Tuscaloosa.

NEXT GAME: Alabama continues a three-game homestand with a visit from the Tennessee Volunteers on Saturday, Oct. 24. The Crimson Tide leads the series 48-36-7. UA enters the game having won the last two meetings with the Volunteers. The Tide posted a 41-17 win in Tuscaloosa in 2007 and then went into Neyland Stadium for a resounding 29-9 win in 2008.

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past two seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has also coincided with success in the classroom. An impressive total of 13 Crimson Tide players are playing this season with degrees already in hand, including Eryk Anders (Health Studies), Drew Davis (marketing), P.J. Fitzgerald (management), Mike Johnson (consumer affairs), Tyrone King (Health Studies), Greg McElroy (business marketing), Cory Reamer (finance), Chris Rogers (consumer affairs), Brian Selman (business marketing), Ali Sharrief (human environmental science), Travis Sikes (consumer affairs), Heath Thomas and Lorenzo Washington (human environmental science). McElroy finished his undergraduate degree in just three years with a 3.86 grade point average while graduating magna cum laude. Additionally, another 10 players are on track to graduate in December of 2009. In 2008, Alabama had six players with degrees already in hand.

TIDE LEADS NATION IN GRADUATES: Alabama's 13 graduates on the 2009 roster are the most of any school in the Bowl Championship Subdivision. The Crimson Tide is five graduates ahead of any other SEC school with Auburn checking in fifth with eight graduates. Boston College and Virginia Tech (the Tide's season-opening opponent) are tied for second with 10 graduates while Penn State is fourth with nine (see sidebar for complete list).

BEATING THE BEST: Alabama is 5-2 against the Associated Press Top 25 over the 2008 and 2009 seasons. The Crimson Tide's 34-24 win over Virginia Tech in the season opener was the Tide's third win over a top-10 team dating back to the start of the 2008 season. Alabama is 2-0 against the AP Top 25 in 2009.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS: The Crimson Tide had five players earn preseason first-team All-America honors prior to the 2009 campaign. Javier Arenas, Terrence Cody, Mike Johnson, Julio Jones and Rolando McClain have garnered at least one first-team designation. McClain leads the way with six first-team honors (a complete list of preseason All-Americans in the sidebar).

SABAN AMONG THE BEST: Head coach Nick Saban's arrival in Tuscaloosa has seen his Crimson Tide vault up the national rankings. That success in such a short period of time has quickly impacted the Tide's record book. Saban produced the largest win increase from year one to year two in school history as Alabama went from seven wins in 2007 to 12 wins in 2008. He is one of two coaches (Bob Stoops, Oklahoma) in the Football Bowl Subdivision football to have coached 10 years and never suffered through a losing season. He also ranks fourth in winning percentage (69.9 percent) among active coaches who have coached at least 10 years of Division I-A football.

DOMINANT 'D': Alabama returned eight starters from a 2008 defense that finished third nationally in total defense, allowing just 263.5 yards per game. The 2009 unit is off to another outstanding start, as well, allowing a total of 218.0 yards per game in the first six outings of 2009 to rank second nationally. Alabama has been impressive throughout the season. Alabama held Virginia Tech to 155 total yards (64 rushing, 91 passing) and 11 first downs while limiting Tech to 2-of-12 on third down conversions and racking up five sacks. Against FIU, Alabama held the Panthers to 214 total yards, including only one yard rushing (213 passing) and 13 first downs while North Texas could only manage 187 yards of offense and 61 yards rushing. Arkansas gained 254 yards, but only managed 63 on the ground while being held to 2 for 14 on third down. The Tide limited No. 20 Mississippi to 197 total yards and just 57 rushing yards, including a mere 19 yards of total offense in the first half against the Rebels. In 2008, Alabama finished second nationally in rushing defense, surrendering 74.14 yards per game. Alabama ranks seventh through six games this season, allowing 63.2 yards per game.

STIFLING DEFENSE PUTTING UP IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS: Alabama's defense over the past 20 games – or two seasons – has developed a reputation for its toughness, talent and pure speed, a reputation verified on the stat sheet. The Crimson Tide has held 17 teams under 100 yards rushing over the past 20 games as only LSU and Florida in 2008 and Kentucky in 2009 were able to crack the 100-yard barrier as a team. In 2009, only Kentucky has managed more than 72 yards rushing on the Tide. UA has surrendered just 1,432 yards on the ground in the last 20 games, an average of 71.6 yards per game. No running back has cracked the 100-yard mark since Mississippi's BenJarvus Green-Ellis went for 131 on Oct. 13, 2007, a span of 25 games.

The Alabama defense has held opponents under 200 yards of total offense in eight of the last 20 games, including a 155-yard effort by Virginia Tech and a 187-yard showing by North Texas in 2009. The sub-200-yard games in that span: Clemson (188); Western Kentucky (158); Tennessee (173); Arkansas State (158); Mississippi State (167); Auburn (170); Virginia Tech (155); North Texas (187).

DEFENSE TOUGH ON THIRD DOWN: The Crimson Tide defense has been strong on third down in 2009, ranking fourth nationally and allowing just a 24.05 conversion rate (19 for 79). Alabama's performance at Mississippi was something special. UA did not allow the Rebels a single third-down conversion as UM went 0 for 9. UA held Virginia Tech to just two conversions on 12 third down attempts (16.7 percent). Florida International was just 7 for 17 (41.1%) on third down while North Texas could only muster a success rate of 28.5 percent (4 for 14). The Tide opened SEC play by limiting Arkansas to 2 for 14 on third down (14.3 percent) and then held Kentucky to 4 of 13 (30.8 percent). That continues a trend for the Crimson Tide after finishing third nationally in third down conversion defense in 2008, holding opponents to a 28.14 percent (56 of 199) conversion rate.

FORCING TURNOVERS: Alabama has produced nine turnovers in the last two games, forcing five turnovers at Mississippi and four at Kentucky. The Tide picked off seven passes in those two games and recovered two fumbles. The Crimson Tide ranks fifth nationally in turnover margin at plus-1.5 per game, including a plus-8 margin in the last two games. The Crimson Tide has forced 62 turnovers in the first 33 games under head coach Nick Saban, an average of 1.88 per game. The Crimson Tide has forced 13 turnovers in the first six games this season, while the UA offense has only turned the ball over four times (1 interception, 3 fumbles).

Alabama forced 24 turnovers in 2007 for a plus-4 turnover ratio and then recorded 25 turnovers and ended the season with a plus-6 turnover margin in 2008. Alabama has recorded at least one turnover in 28 of 33 games under Saban. The Crimson Tide is 22-6 under Saban when they have at least one turnover. Alabama is 3-2 in games without a turnover over the last three seasons.

PASS RUSH IMPORTANT FOR BAMA DEFENSE: The Alabama defense will be looking to get pressure on South Carolina quarterback Stephen Garcia in an effort to slow down a dangerous Gamecocks passing attack. The Crimson Tide defense exploded for five sacks in each of their first two games of the 2009 season and have 16 on the season after recording 26 during the entire 2008 season. UA ranks tied for 29th nationally in sacks with 2.67 per game. The Gamecocks offensive line has surrendered an average of 2.5 sacks per game coming in (93rd nationally). Linebacker Eryk Anders (-32 yards) and defensive end Marcell Dareus lead the way for the Tide with 3.5 sacks each, while cornerback Javier Arenas is second on the team with 3 sacks for losses of 31 yards and linebacker Rolando McClain has two sacks (-19 yards).

UA is 28th nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 7.0 per game. That mark ranks second in the Southeastern Conference and accounts for 208 lost yards by UA opponents. Anders leads the Tide with 6.5 TFLs (-50 yards), while Dareus (-29 yards) and McClain (-26 yards) have 5.5 each.

A LITTLE BIT BETTER THAN LAST YEAR: The Tide offense has stepped it up through the first six games of the 2009 season, compared to the first six games of the 2008 campaign. The Tide is averaging 3 points per game more in 2009 and 66 more total yards per game than last season. The passing offense is where the major improvement has been seen with UA throwing for 1,327 yards and nine touchdowns in 2009, compared to just 914 yards and six scores at the same time last season.

On defense, Alabama is surrendering fewer total yards through six games. The Tide allowed 1,573 yards (262.2 ypg) in the first six games last season and just 1,323 yards (220.5 ypg - second nationally) so far this year. The UA passing defense has also improved, surrendering just 154.8 yards per game (seventh nationally) after giving up 211.1 yards at this time last year.

ALABAMA IN THE AP

Alabama has been ranked in 636 of the 996 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 378-128-10 all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including an 18-5 mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 21st consecutive game (including all 14 last season), its longest streak since the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 consecutive weeks under Coach Gene Stallings.

UA IN THE COACHES' POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the last half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. The USA Today took over the poll in 1991 and has run the poll for the last 19 seasons. Alabama was ranked No. 5 in the 2009 preseason coaches' poll after not being ranked in last year's preseason poll. Alabama entered the rankings after beating Clemson and was ranked in the coaches poll for the remainder of the season, reaching No. 1 in the polls for five weeks in November. The Tide has five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and USA Today (1992) coaches poll national titles.

A BALANCED ATTACK: Alabama made its name a season ago with a punishing ground attack that wore down defenses and took shots down the field. In 2009, the Tide has brought more balance to the table. Although UA still has an outstanding ground game, the aerial attack of quarterback Greg McElroy and a more seasoned crop of wide receivers, tight ends and running backs has given the Tide a little more offensive punch. The Tide has shown good balance in their offensive numbers, averaging 223.5 rushing yards (11th nationally) and 221.2 yards passing (60th nationally) per game, which gives UA the 17th-ranked total offense in the nation (444.7 ypg). On the ground, Alabama is rushing the ball an average of 43.3 times per game for 5.16 yards per rush. The passing game is averaging 27.8 pass attempts per contest for an average of 7.95 yards per attempt. Those numbers are leading to more points on the scoreboard. UA averaged 30.1 points per game last season and is averaging 37.0 points per game in 2009 to rank 12th nationally.

INGRAM OFF TO THE RACES: Sophomore running back Mark Ingram is off to a start in 2009 that should put him at or near the top of the list for the Doak Walker Award, which goes to the nation's top running back. He has rushed for 659 yards and seven touchdowns through six games this season for a 109.83 yards per game average to rank 14th nationally and fourth in the SEC in rushing. Ingram has also added 17 receptions for 163 yards and three scores. In week one, he showed a national television audience why he was named to the watch list for the Doak Walker Award by rushing for 150 yards and a touchdown against No. 7 Virginia Tech. He came off the bench (due to flu-like symptoms) against FIU with 103 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns (one rushing, one receiving). He followed that with 91 rushing yards and a touchdown on just eight carries (11.4 yards per rush) against North Texas. He accounted for 129 total yards vs. the Mean Green with three receptions for 38 yards and a touchdown. Against Arkansas, he ran for 50 yards and a touchdown while catching three passes for 21 yards and a score. Ingram was again the workhorse at Kentucky with 140 yards on 22 carries and two touchdowns. At Mississippi, he carried the Tide to a 22-3 win with a career-best 172 yards on the ground on 28 carries and three receptions for 16 yards for a total of 188 all-purpose yards.

INGRAM, RODGERS & GERHART ELITE RUSHERS IN 100/10 CLUB: There are only three players in the country with a 100+ rushing yards per game average and 10 or more total touchdowns. Jacquizz Rodgers at Oregon State is averaging 116.2 ypg and leads the nation with 13 total touchdowns. Toby Gerhart of Stanford and Mark Ingram of Alabama are the other two in this elite group. Gerhart is averaging 124.3 ypg with 10 scores and Ingram checks in at 109.8 ypg with 10 touchdowns as well. Here's a look:

INGRAM FINDING THE END ZONE: Mark Ingram has shown the ability to find the end zone during his Alabama career. The sophomore has at least one rushing touchdown in nine of his last 10 games and at least one in each game of the 2009 season. He also has a receiving touchdown in three games this season. Overall, Ingram has scored at least one touchdown in 15 of his 20 career games for the Tide. He has 22 career touchdowns (three receiving), including a freshman record 12 (all rushing) in 2008. In 2009, Ingram ranks first in the SEC in touchdown scoring and second in total scoring at 10.0 points per game while ranking tied for 13th nationally. He has seven rushing touchdowns and three receiving scores this season.

BALL SECURITY: Mark Ingram has also developed an impressive reputation during his 20-game Alabama career as the Flint, Mich., native is an expert at holding onto the football. The sophomore has not lost a fumble in 254 career rushing attempts and 24 career receptions for a total of 278 career touches. He has only put the ball on the ground one time (at LSU in 2008), which was recovered by the Tide. He has 1,387 rushing yards in those 20 games with 19 rushing touchdowns while also catching 24 passes for 220 yards and three scores.

McELROY ON THE MARK: Greg McElroy has been impressive in his first six games as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback, completing 60.8 percent (93 of 153) of his passes for 1,233 yards and nine touchdowns with only one interception. The junior boasts a 146.58 passing efficiency rating, which ranks 26th nationally. He has won his last 22 starts at quarterback, going 16-0 as a high school senior in 2005 and 6-0 for the Tide in 2009. In his collegiate starting debut against Virginia Tech, the Southlake, Texas, native threw for 230 yards on 15-of-30 passing with one touchdown and one interception in leading the Crimson Tide to a win over the No. 7 team in the country. The 230 yards ranks as the fourth-highest total by a quarterback in his UA debut behind Brodie Croyle (285), Andrew Zow (272) and John Parker Wilson (253).

McELROY STREAKING: Greg McElroy has strung together some pretty impressive passing numbers during his first six starts at quarterback for the Tide - beyond taking into account his 6-0 record. Since halftime of the season opener against No. 7 Virginia Tech, McElroy has completed 88-of-135 passes for 1,139 yards, nine touchdowns and no interceptions. That computes to a 65.2 completion percentage, a 158.06 collegiate passer rating and a 113.78 NFL passer rating over those 22 quarters of play. He set a new Alabama record for consecutive completions against FIU by connecting on 14 straight passes. Against North Texas, he tied the school mark for highest completion percentage with a minimum of 10 completions, going 13 for 15 (86.7 percent). McElroy has not thrown an interception in 141 pass attempts, dating back to a second quarter pick against Virginia Tech in the opener. That streak of 141 passes ranks third in the Alabama record book, behind Brodie Croyle (190) and Jay Barker (155).

RICHARDSON HAS IMPRESSIVE ROOKIE CAMPAIGN: True freshman running back Trent Richardson has enjoyed an impressive rookie season. The Pensacola, Fla., native has rushed for 346 yards and four touchdowns on just 61 attempts. He is averaging 5.7 yards per carry and 57.7 yards per game. He rushed for 118 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries against FIU in just his second career game. He followed that up with 87 yards on 11 carries (7.9 ypc) against North Texas and 65 yards and a score vs. Arkansas. Richardson scored on runs of nine and 35 yards in the second half vs. FIU, plunged in from one-yard out against North Texas and then broke five tackles en route to a 52-yard touchdown vs. Arkansas.

MULTIPLE OPTIONS CREATE DIVERSE OFFENSIVE ATTACK: One of the keys for the Tide's high-powered offense in 2009 has been its ability to find playmakers all over the field. UA quarterbacks, led by starter Greg McElroy, have completed 60.8 percent of their passes to an impressive 14 different receivers in the first six games of the 2009 season. That includes the SEC opener against Arkansas where McElroy spread out 17 completions to nine different receiving targets. The UA receiving numbers are headed by running back Mark Ingram and tight end Colin Peek, who have both caught 17 passes. Ingram also has three touchdowns and 163 yards while Peek has one score and 192 yards. Next is wide receiver Julio Jones, who has 13 catches for 175 yards and a score. Marquis Maze has 12 catches for a team-high 242 yards and two touchdowns. Junior Darius Hanks follows (9 catches, 160 yards & 1 TD) and senior Mike McCoy (8 catches, 138 yard & 1 TD) are next. In all, the Tide has 48 receptions from its wide receivers, 32 from backs and 22 from tight ends.

ARENAS NEARING SEC & NCAA PUNT RETURN YARDAGE RECORD: Senior cornerback and return specialist Javier Arenas is quickly sneaking up on the all-time great punt returners in college football history. He has already broken all of the Crimson Tide punt return records, and now has his sights set on the SEC and NCAA records as well. He is the NCAA active leader in career punt returns, yards, touchdowns, returns per game and yards per game. Arenas, who has 1,546 career punt return yards on 110 returns, is just 150 punt return yards away from breaking Lee Nalley's long-standing SEC record of 1,695 (102 returns for a 14.4 ypr average). Nalley set that record from 1947-1949 and it stood for 54 years as the NCAA record until Texas Tech's Wes Welker broke it in 2003. Welker finished his Tech career with 1,761 punt return yards and Arenas needs 216 yards to break his record and become the NCAA's all-time leader in punt return yards.

TIME OF POSSESSION: An Alabama trademark over the past two seasons has been its ability to control the line of scrimmage offensively and, consequently, control the tempo of the game. This has played out with an impressive advantage in time of possession. A year ago the Crimson Tide finished 11th nationally with an average time of possession of 32:08. In 2009, the Crimson Tide is off to another great start in that category, ranking seventh nationally at 34:08. The Tide held the ball for 37:02 in the opener against Virginia Tech and then a season-best 38:19 at Mississippi. UA also won possession time against FIU (31:38), North Texas (30:43), Arkansas (33:36) and Kentucky (33:30). The Crimson Tide has won the time of possession battle in 15 of the last 20 games overall and all six contests in 2009.

DIVERSE SCORING: The Alabama offense has been able to score in a hurry while also showing the ability to grind out the long, time-consuming scoring drive as well. The Crimson Tide has scored 15 touchdowns in three minutes or less, including eight that found the end zone in three or less plays. On the flip side, Alabama has grinded out eight scoring drives (seven touchdowns & one field goal) that have included 10 or more plays and 5:00 of possession time. The Tide has logged five touchdowns that have consisted of 13 plays. Alabama has also pounded out seven drives of 80 yards or more, including three drives of 95 yards or more (99, 97 & 95).

TIDE PLAYERS EARN EARLY ACCOLADES: Eight Alabama players were named to 11 different preseason awards watch lists prior to the 2009 season. The players were recognized as potentially the top players at their position nationally.

Both Rolando McClain and Terrence Cody appeared on five watch lists. McClain is on the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award (best defensive player), Dick Butkus Award (top linebacker), Lombardi Trophy (top lineman or linebacker), Lott Trophy (best defensive player) and Nagurski Trophy (defensive player of the year). As a sophomore, McClain led the Tide with 95 tackles and 12 tackles for loss. Cody is also up for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Trophy, Lott Trophy, Nagurski Award and Outland Trophy. Last year as a junior, Cody recorded 24 tackles, 4 ½ tackles for loss and recovered two fumbles for the Tide. Other defensive players on preseason awards lists included Arenas (Nagurski and Thorpe) and Hightower (Butkus and Lombardi).

The Crimson Tide offense was represented by Mark Ingram, Mike Johnson and Julio Jones. Jones appears on the Biletnikoff Award (best receiver) and Maxwell Trophy (player of the year), while Johnson is on both the Lombardi and Outland watch lists for outstanding linemen. Ingram appears on the Doak Walker Award list, presented the nation's top running back. Last year as a freshman, Ingram ran for 712 yards and a freshman record 12 touchdowns. Senior Leigh Tiffin was named to the Lou Groza Award list, which is given to the nation's top place kicker.

FRESHMAN ACADEMICS: Alabama's heralded 2008 freshman class did more than just excel on the football field, the Crimson Tide placed 12 rookies on the 2009 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, by far the highest total in the SEC with Georgia coming in second with seven honorees. The Tide's freshmen academic honorees were Undra Billingsley, John Michael Boswell, Jerrell Harris, Mark Ingram, Barrett Jones, Chris Jordan, Tyler Love, Wesley Neighbors, Brad Smelley, Corey Smith, Damion Square and Michael Williams. Each student-athlete must have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or above and be on scholarship or a letter winner. They also must completed 24 semester hours of non-remedial credit at the nominating institution and have been a member of the varsity team for the sport's entire NCAA Championship segment.

VLACHOS, TIFFIN HONORED: Junior center William Vlachos was named the Southeastern Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week and senior kicker Leigh Tiffin was named the Lou Groza Award "Star of Stars" for their efforts in the Crimson Tide's 22-3 win at Mississippi on Oct. 10, in Oxford.

Vlachos played all 76 offensive snaps in the Crimson Tide's 22-3 win at No. 20 Mississippi this past Saturday in Oxford. The Mountain Brook native helped clear the way for sophomore running back Mark Ingram's career-high 172 rushing yards in the win over the Rebels. Ingram added a 36-yard burst in the second quarter for the Tide's only touchdown. Vlachos anchored an offensive front that paved the way for 4.9 yards per carry on Saturday. He also did not allow sack or get called for any penalties.

Vlachos earned Alabama's fifth SEC Player of the Week honor this season, joining Ingram (vs. Virginia Tech), Trent Richardson (vs. Florida International and Arkansas) and Rolando McClain (vs. Kentucky).

Tiffin earned his second "Star of Stars" award of the 2009 season after making all five field goals attempts against the Rebels on Saturday. Tiffin made field goals of 21, 21, 22, 25 and 31 yards to move into second place on the Alabama charts with 67 field goals, trailing Philip Doyle's school-record mark by 11 field goals. Tiffin's 14 made field goals this season tie him for the nation's lead. He leads the SEC and ranks third nationally with 2.33 field goals per game. Tiffin also earned "Star of Stars" recognition following the Tide's season-opening win over Virginia Tech.

UA COACHES PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: The Alabama coaching staff recognized eight players of the week following the Crimson Tide's 22-3 win over No. 20 Mississippi on Saturday. Mark Ingram, Vlachos and Barrett Jones were honored as offensive players of the week while Rolando McClain and Kareem Jackson took home defensive honors. Cory Reamer, Leigh Tiffin and Nico Johnson garnered special teams honors.

Vlachos and Jones blocked for Ingram to rush for a career-high 172 yards and his seventh rushing touchdown and 10 total touchdown of the season. Ingram busted loose for a 36-yard touchdown run late the second quarter on fourth and one for the Tide's only touchdown. McClain registered seven tackles, one tackle for loss, his second interception of the season and a quarterback hurry. Jackson notched his first pick of the season in the second half and returned it 79 yards. He also made four solo tackles as the Tide defense limited the Rebels to just 197 total yards and 57 rushing yards. Tiffin paced the special teams, going 5 for 5 on field goals, which was a career high and one shy of the Alabama single-game record. He scored 16 total points to move into third place on the UA career scoring list. Reamer and Johnson were everywhere on the Tide's cover teams. Reamer recorded a tackle, blocked a punt which led to a field goal and forced a fumble and then recovered it to setup another Tiffin field goal.

ALABAMA-SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES IN-DEPTH: Alabama leads the all-time series with South Carolina, 11-2. The Crimson Tide and Gamecocks first met on Oct. 9, 1937, with the Tide posting a 20-0 win. In fact the first three games in the series were all shutout wins for Alabama. The Crimson Tide beat the Gamecocks 29-0 in 1942 and 55-0 in 1945. Alabama made its first trek to Columbia during the 1946 season and came away with a 14-6 victory. The two teams would not meet again until a three-game series in 1965, 1966 and 1967. The Crimson Tide won all three games, including shutout wins in 1966 (24-0) and 1967 (17-0). Alabama and South Carolina will be meeting for the just seventh time since the Gamecocks joined the SEC in 1992. Alabama has won four of the first six meetings in SEC play. The Crimson Tide posted a 48-7 homecoming win during the 1992 season and followed with a 17-6 win in Columbia in 1993. The Crimson Tide and Gamecocks split a home-and-home series in 2001-02. Alabama posted a 27-17 win in Tuscaloosa, before dropping a 37-36 shootout in Columbia in 2001. The Gamecocks extended their series winning streak to two games with a 20-6 win over the Tide in Tuscaloosa in 2004. Alabama won the next year, 37-14, in Columbia. Alabama holds an 8-1 series lead in games played in the state of Alabama, including a 7-1 mark in Tuscaloosa. Alabama has won three of the four meetings with South Carolina in Columbia.

SABAN VS. SOUTH CAROLINA: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 2-0 in his collegiate career against South Carolina, with both wins coming while he was head coach at LSU. Saban led the Tigers to a 38-14 win over the Gamecocks on Oct. 19, 2002, in Baton Rouge and a 33-7 win on Oct. 18, 2003, in Columbia.

SPURRIER VS. ALABAMA: South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier is 6-4 in his career against Alabama, with nine of those meetings taking place while the head coach at Florida from 1990-2001. Spurrier was 6-3 against the Tide as the Gators head coach, posting regular season wins in 1990, 1991 and 1998 and three wins in the SEC Championship Game (1993, 1994 and 1996). UA picked up two wins in the SEC Championship Game (1992 and 1999) and one regular season win (1999). The Crimson Tide won two games during the 1999 SEC Championship season, beating Florida, 40-39, in overtime on Oct. 2 in Gainesville and 34-7 in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta on Dec. 4. Spurrier is 0-1 against Alabama since becoming the head coach at South Carolina. The Crimson Tide beat the Gamecocks 37-14 during the 2005 season in Columbia. Spurrier is 2-0 against Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium, winning 17-13 in 1990 and 16-10 in 1998.

SOUTH CAROLINA NATIVES: The Alabama football roster lists only one player from the state of South Carolina, freshman defensive lineman Chris Bonds (Richland Northeast HS/Columbia).

ALABAMA NATIVES: The South Carolina football roster lists three players from the state of Alabama, including junior offensive lineman Heath Batchelor (Haleyville HS), freshman safety Jarrett Burns (Lee HS, Huntsville), senior strong safety Darian Stewart (Lee HS, Huntsville), freshman defensive lineman Chris Bonds (Richland Northeast HS/Columbia).

ALABAMA-SOUTH CAROLINA TIES: There are several ties to the Alabama-South Carolina coaching staffs heading into Saturday's Alabama-South Carolina game. South Carolina assistant head coach/linebackers coach Ellis Johnson served two coaching stints at Alabama under Gene Stallings (1990-93) and Mike DuBose (1997-2000). South Carolina defensive coordinator and secondary coach Lorenzo Ward played and coached at Alabama. Ward played for Bill Curry and Gene Stallings and earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1991. He later served as a graduate assistant coach under Stallings in 1991 and 1993.

ALABAMA CELEBRATES HOMECOMING: Alabama will play its 89th Homecoming football game this Saturday when the Crimson Tide hosts South Carolina at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama has compiled a 74-13-1 (.839) all-time homecoming record, including a 35-0 win over Arkansas State on Nov. 1, 2008. The Crimson Tide is riding a seven-game homecoming winning streak dating back to the 2002 season. UA has not lost on homecoming since a 35-21 loss to LSU (coached by Nick Saban) on Nov. 3, 2001. Alabama's current seven-game homecoming winning streak is the longest streak since a school-record 26-game winning streak from 1958-83. The first homecoming game took place on Armistice Day during the 1920 season. J.T. O'Connor, a senior back from St. Louis, Mo., scored two touchdowns and kicked all three extra points in the 21-0 win. From 1929-39, Alabama won 11 consecutive homecoming games. The streak was snapped with a 13-0 loss to Mississippi State on Nov. 30, 1940. After the loss to MSU, Alabama reeled off a nine-game winning streak from 1941-50. UA did not play football in 1943. The Crimson Tide followed that 10-game winning streak with a 2-4-1 (.429) record in its next seven homecoming games from 1951-57. The Tide's 30-21 loss to Florida on Nov. 24, 1951 snapped a nine-game homecoming winning streak. Alabama posted a school-record 26-game homecoming winning streak from 1958-83. Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant was a perfect 25-0 in homecoming games at Alabama from 1958-82. Coach Ray Perkins extended

the streak to 26 games with a 44-13 win over Memphis State on Oct. 1, 1983. The streak ended the following year with a 30-21 loss to Vanderbilt on Sept. 29, 1984. Alabama defeated Southwestern Louisiana (now Louisiana-Lafayette) 38-10 on Oct. 3, 1987 at Birmingham's Legion Field in the only homecoming game not played on the UA campus. The Crimson Tide played all of its games at Legion Field during the 1987 season as Bryant-Denny Stadium underwent an expansion project. Since 1984, Alabama has compiled an 18-6 homecoming record over the last 24 years.

TIDE GETTING OFFENSIVE: Alabama's offense is off to a solid start under first-year quarterback Greg McElroy. The Crimson Tide has piled up 2,668 yards of total offense this season (444.7 ypg) in their six games this season. The 1,039 yards combined vs. FIU and North Texas are the most by Alabama in back-to-back games since compiling 1,104 yards in consecutive games against South Carolina (516) and UTEP (588) during the 2001 season. Alabama had its best offensive output of the season vs. North Texas, and its third- and fourth-best offensive showings in the Saban era against FIU and UNT. In the season opener, Alabama racked up 498 yards of total offense, the sixth-best offensive day under Saban, in 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech.

30-PLUS: For the first time since 1979, and just the third time in school history, Alabama opened the season with five straight games of 30 points or more. The Tide also accomplished the feat in 1920. It was just the seventh time in school history Alabama had five consecutive games of 30 points or more with the most recent being the season-opening streak in 1979. The longest such streak is seven games, which came from Sept. 18 - Oct. 30 in 1971. The 1971 team also set the school record for most 30-point games with nine. Alabama had seven (tied for third) in 2008. In 2009, the Tide opened with 34 points against Virginia Tech, scored 40 vs. FIU and the hung 53 against North Texas - the most points for a UA team since 2001. The Crimson Tide then put up 35 points in the SEC opener against Arkansas and followed that with 38 points on the road at Kentucky.

DAREUS MAKES A NAME FOR HIMSELF: Following an exceptional fall camp, sophomore defensive lineman Marcell Dareus has started the 2009 season in dominant fashion. He had a breakout game in the season opener against Virginia Tech and then another excellent performance against Florida International. Against Tech, Dareus had two total tackles, including 1.5 sacks, as he harassed Tech signal-caller Tyrod Taylor into 9-of-20 passing for just 91 yards. He followed that up with a four-tackle outing against FIU during which he posted 2 sacks for 17 yards in losses. Dareus added one tackle in a blowout win over North Texas and two solo stops vs. Arkansas with a tackle for loss (-1). He has 17 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss (-29), 3.5 sacks (-25) and four quarterback hurries this season.

ALABAMA 23-1 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Alabama has led at the half of its last five games. The Crimson Tide is 23-1 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban, including a 17-game winning streak. The only loss came against LSU during the 2007 season when UA held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing, 41-34, on Nov. 3, 2007, at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide is 1-5 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 1-2 when tied at halftime. The lone win when trailing at the half came in the 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech in the 2009 season opener in Atlanta. Alabama's lone win when tied at halftime came last year at LSU.

TIFFIN MOVES UP CAREER SCORING CHART: Alabama senior placekicker Leigh Tiffin is rapidly moving up the Alabama career scoring chart. After the conclusion of the Mississippi game, when he kicked five field goals and scored 16 points, the Muscle Shoals, Ala., native passed his father, Van (312), for third place on the Tide's all-time in the career list (317) and has now set his sight on second-place Michael Proctor with 326 career points.

TIFFIN No. 2 ON UA'S CAREER FIELD GOALS LIST: Senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin converted a personal best five field goals at Mississippi to give him 67 career field goals, second all-time at Alabama. He surpassed his father, Van Tiffin (59 from 1983-86) earlier this season against North Texas and the moved past Michael Proctor vs. Mississippi. Tiffin's 67 field goals leaves him just 12 shy of the school record held by Philip Doyle (78 from 1987-90).

THREE ADDED TO WATCH LISTS: A trio of Alabama football players - junior quarterback Greg McElroy, sophomore running back Mark Ingram and senior cornerback/return specialist Javier Arenas - were added to a pair of 2009 watch lists. McElroy and Ingram were added to the watch list for the 73rd Maxwell Award, which is presented to the best player in college football. Arenas was added to the watch list for the 15th Chuck Bednarik Award, which is given annually to the best defensive player in college football.

MCCLAIN EARNS NATIONAL HONOR: Alabama linebacker Rolando McClain was named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Kentucky. McClain, a 6-4, 258-pound junior from Decatur, Ala., registered a game- and season-high 12 tackles (eight unassisted) made his first interception of the 2009 season, forced a fumble that was returned for a touchdown, notched a quarterback hurry and recorded a pass deflection in Alabama's 38-20 victory. McClain's forced fumble led to a 45-yard touchdown return that gave the Crimson Tide a 21-6 halftime lead. Then, his 21-yard interception return on the first possession of the third quarter set up another Alabama touchdown. His third-quarter pass deflection resulted in an interception that led to a field goal. McClain now has 42 tackles on the season to pace the Tide. He also has a team-high 5.5 tackles for loss (-26)

TIFFIN NAMED LOU GROZA "STAR OF THE WEEK": Senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin was named a Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" on Sept. 8 after converting 4-of-5 field goal attempts against Virginia Tech, making good on attempts from 49, 34, 43 and 20 yards. That matched his single-game best at Alabama previously achieved three times (vs. Tennessee, Oct. 20, 2007; Mississippi State on Nov. 10, 2007; Clemson on Aug. 30, 2008) and ranks second in Alabama history (6 by Philip Doyle vs. Southwestern Louisiana on Oct. 6, 1990).

BAMA SCORES ON BIG PLAYS: Alabama's first three touchdowns against Arkansas occurred on plays of longer than 50 yards - a 52-yard run by Trent Richardson, a 50-yard pass from Greg McElroy to Julio Jones, and a 80-yard pass from McElroy to Marquis Maze. Those plays accounted for 182 of Alabama's 287 total yards through the midway point of the third quarter.

On the year, the Alabama offense has 22 plays of 20 yard or more with eight of those plays going for touchdowns. The Tide also has 10 plays of 35 yards or more with five of those going to scores.

ALABAMA'S 53 POINTS: The Crimson Tide's 53 points in its win over North Texas were the most during head coach Nick Saban's tenure at the Capstone. The previous high of 52 came on Sept. 1, 2007, against Western Carolina in his first game at Alabama. Additionally, the 53 points are the most scored by Alabama since beating UTEP, 56-7, on Oct. 6, 2001, at Legion Field in Birmingham. The 53 points are the most at Bryant-Denny Stadium since a 62-0 win over Tulane on Oct. 12, 1991.

DEADERICK UNDAUNTED: Senior defensive tackle Brandon Deaderick completed a miraculous return to the playing field with an appearance in the Crimson Tide's win over Virginia Tech, just 5 days after being shot by an unknown assailant on Monday night, August 31, in Tuscaloosa. Deaderick, who suffered non-life threatening injuries to his left forearm and hip in the incident, was cleared for action by team doctors. He saw his first action on special teams with 6:35 left to play in the first quarter on Virginia Tech's point-after conversion following a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown that tied the game at 6-6. Deaderick saw action on defense with 3:00 left in the first quarter. He finished with one solo tackle vs. the Hokies. He has played in all six games this season and has accounted for nine tackles.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS: Fourteen Alabama players (9 on offense, 5 on defense) have made their first career starts for the Crimson Tide this season. On defense, senior linebacker Eryk Anders, sophomore defensive back Mark Barron and sophomore defensive lineman Marcell Dareus were first-time starters against Virginia Tech before sophomore free safety Robby Green made his first career start as the Tide employed five defensive backs on the first play of scrimmage against FIU and Courtney Upshaw got his first start at Kentucky. On offense, junior left tackle James Carpenter, sophomore center William Vlachos, sophomore right guard Barrett Jones, senior tight end Colin Peek, sophomore tight end/H-back Brad Smelley and junior quarterback Greg McElroy made their first starts against Tech. Against FIU, senior running back Roy Upchurch made his first start for the Crimson Tide and Darius Hanks started his first game vs. North Texas.

TIDE CAPTURES 800TH WIN: The storied Alabama football program captured the program's 800th win on Sept. 5 in Atlanta with a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech. Alabama is the seventh school in the Football Bowl Subdivision to reach the 800-win plateau. The Crimson Tide holds an 805-316-43 all-time record for a .710 winning percentage that ranks sixth in FBS history. The other six programs to record 800 wins: Michigan (876); Texas (837); Notre Dame (835); Nebraska (821); Ohio State (812); Penn State (805).

14 NATIONAL TV GAMES IN LAST TWO YEARS: The South Carolina game on ESPN will be the Crimson Tide's 14th national television game since the start of the 2008 season. UA opened the season with a national ABC broadcast against Virginia Tech and then CBS broadcast the Arkansas and Mississippi games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games broadcast nationally, including five games on CBS, three games on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX. The 10 nationally broadcast games last year were tied with Notre Dame for the most in the nation.

BEST COACHING STARTS: Nick Saban has compiled a 25-8 (.758) record in his career with the Tide and the 25 wins rank in a tie for the fourth-most for any Crimson Tide head football coach after 33 games. Xen Scott and Bill Curry also posted 25 wins through their first 33 games with the Crimson Tide. Wallace Wade holds the record for most wins after 33 games with 29 victories. Frank Thomas is second with 28 wins in 33 games while Gene Stallings third with 27. Below are the most wins by Alabama coaches after the first 33 and 34 games in their career.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw four players selected in the 2009 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Andre Smith, who went to the Cincinnati Bengals with the No. 6 overall pick. Glen Coffee (San Francisco), Antoine Caldwell (Houston) and Rashad Johnson (Arizona) all went off the board in the third round. The four picks were the most for the Tide since five players were taken in 2005.

RETURNING SUCCESS: Much of the talk in the preseason was about Alabama's vaunted defense, and the defensive side of the football is where the Crimson Tide returned the biggest portion of its players from last year's Sugar Bowl team. UA features 15 total returning starters and 55 lettermen this season, but eight of those returning starters are on the defensive side of the football with four on offense and both specialists. The Tide returned 90 percent of its lettermen on defense and 73 percent on offense. The defense returns 84 percent of the tackles (728 of 866) from 2008. The special teams returned almost completely intact with place-kicker Leigh Tiffin, punter P.J. Fitzgerald, snapper Brian Selman and return specialist Javier Arenas.

NICK'S KIDS: At Michigan State, head coach Nick Saban and his wife Terry started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans have continued in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise over \$1 million - including over \$300,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 160 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

STADIUM RENOVATION: The newest expansion project for Bryant-Denny Stadium will see an increase in seating capacity to approximately 101,000, keeping it among the largest on-campus football stadiums in the nation. The expansion, which is expected to be complete for the beginning of the 2010 season, will be the fourth expansion of this magnificent edifice since 1988 and the seventh expansion in the stadium's history. This renovation will mirror north end zone project that was completed in 2006. It will consist of roughly 8,500 additional seats, 1,700 South Zone Club seats, two corner video boards, an upper concourse with concessions and restrooms, 36 skyboxes, offices Donors Hall of Fame and an outdoor market for food and merchandise.

NEW HIRES: The Alabama football staff features two new faces in 2009, including linebackers' coaches Sal Sunseri and James Willis. Sunseri joins the staff spending the last seven seasons as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Carolina Panthers where he coached the likes of Pro Bowl players Julius Peppers, Mike Rucker and Kris Jenkins. Willis joined Saban's staff after spending three years with Auburn where he worked with former Saban assistant Will Muschamp. He spent seven seasons in the NFL prior to beginning his coaching career.

TOP AIDES: Alabama's coaching staff has a wealth of knowledge across all levels of football. The nine-man Crimson Tide staff features a former head coach at the Bowl Subdivision level in Bobby Williams (Michigan State). The staff also has six coaches that have spent time as assistant coaches in the NFL in Bo Davis (Dolphins), Jim McElwain (Raiders), Joe Pendry (19 years with multiple teams), Kirby Smart (Dolphins), Sal Sunseri (Panthers) and Bobby Williams (Lions and Dolphins). Alabama's coaching staff boasts 40-plus years of combined NFL coaching experience.

THREE TIDE PLAYERS NAMED PLAYBOY ALL-AMERICANS: Alabama landed three players on the 2009 *Playboy Magazine* annual preseason College Football All-America Team. Rolando McClain was selected as a linebacker while Julio Jones was picked at wide receiver and Javier Arenas was the return specialist. Alabama has now had four *Playboy* All-Americans in the last two years after Andre Smith was chosen in 2008.

BURNS AND COCHRAN HONORED: Associate head coach and running backs coach Burton Burns along with head strength and conditioning coach Scott Cochran were named the nation's best at their respective fields in 2008. Burns was named college football's 2008 FootballScoop Running Backs Coach of the Year, while Cochran was tabbed as the 2008 Samson Strength & Conditioning Coach of the Year for his work with the Crimson Tide in the weight room.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 181-115-5 (.608) all-time record in 301 televised games. This does not include pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts. The Crimson Tide owns a 156-96-3 (.616) record in 255 regular-season televised games.

OVERTIME RECORD: Alabama is 4-7 (.364) all-time in overtime games. In its last overtime game, the Crimson Tide defeated LSU, 27-21, at Tiger Stadium on Nov. 8, 2008. Alabama has lost six of its last nine overtime games. The Crimson Tide is 4-6 (.400) in overtime games against SEC teams. Alabama is 2-4 (.333) in overtime home games. The Crimson Tide is 3-4 (.429) in single-overtime games.

A-DAY SUCCESS: Alabama has led the SEC in spring football game attendance each of the last three seasons, averaging 84,769 fans for Coach Nick Saban's three A-Day football games at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama drew a then-NCAA record 92,138 fans for Saban's first spring football game on April 21, 2007. In 2008, Alabama led the SEC again with 78,200 fans for its A-Day game on April 12. The Tide again set the pace in the SEC with 84,050 fans on April 17, 2009.

- Saban brings a 116-50-1 (.698) record as a college head coach into his third season in Tuscaloosa. He has three conference championships and nine teams have played in post-season bowl games, including a trip to the Allstate Sugar Bowl last season.

- Saban one of two (Bob Stoops, Oklahoma) current Football Bowl Subdivision coach to coach for at least 10 years and not suffer a losing season. In 2008, Saban produced the largest win increase from year one to year two in school history as Alabama went from seven wins in 2007 to 12 wins in 2008. He also garnered six national coach of the year awards last year, including the Home Depot Coach of the year, the FWAA/Eddie Robinson, Associated Press, Sporting News, Walter Camp and Liberty Mutual. Saban also spent a little time behind the camera during the offseason. He flew to Los Angeles and film an ESPN College GameDay commercial with Kirk Herbstreit and Chris Fowler. Saban also filmed scenes for the movie *Blindside*, which chronicles the life of former Mississippi offensive tackle Michael Oher.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen.

- Saban also is a published author. He co-authored "Tiger Turnaround" in 2001, a book documenting his first two years as head coach at LSU, and co-authored "How Good Do You Want to Be" in 2005, a book that offers real-life principles for success at work and at home.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$1 million - including more than \$300,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 160 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

- Saban and his wife, Terry, supported several charitable and civic projects in Louisiana. The largest of those efforts was with the Children's Miracle Network, for which Terry and Nick raised more than \$100,000 a year for children.

- Saban was on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of *Forbes* magazine. The article, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of *Forbes* since the publication began in 1917.

- The Saban's pledged \$1 million to the University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

HISTORY OF ALABAMA FOOTBALL

- The University of Alabama is in its 115th football season and has compiled an 805-316-43 (.710) all-time record in 1,164 games.
- Alabama won its 800th game on Sept. 5, 2009, with a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech in the Chick-fil-A College Kickoff at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. The Tide is the seventh program in Football Bowl Subdivision history to win 800 games.
- The Crimson Tide played its first football game on Nov. 11, 1892, with a 56-0 win over Birmingham High School in Birmingham.
- Alabama is tied for fifth among Division I schools in terms of all-time wins.
- The Crimson Tide football legacy includes 12 national championships, 21 SEC championships and 92 All-Americans.
- UA also ranks among the best in post-season play, holding the NCAA record for most bowl games (56) and most bowl wins (31).
- Alabama ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 29 10-win seasons. Alabama's enduring success on the gridiron is further reflected in the fact that the Crimson Tide has recorded seasons with 10 or more wins in nine different decades since the first double-digit win season in 1920 (10-1).
- Alabama has compiled a 351-159-20 (.681) record in 530 SEC games since 1933.
- Alabama has played in more SEC games (530), has more wins (351) and has won more league titles (21) than any team in SEC history. The Tide also has more SEC wins than Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Arkansas and South Carolina combined.
- Alabama is the only SEC school to win a championship in every decade since the 1930s. The Crimson Tide's last SEC Championship came in 1999.
- Alabama became the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in a decade in the 1970s. The Crimson Tide posted a 103-16-1 (.863) record from 1970-79, which included eight SEC Championships and three national titles.

BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM

- Alabama's on-campus home since 1929, Bryant-Denny Stadium is one of college football's most scenic venues.
- The Crimson Tide has compiled an all-time record of 221-46-3 (.824) in 270 games at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- The stadium was originally named for former University of Alabama President Dr. George H. Denny. Dr. Denny was named UA President on Jan. 1, 1912 and amassed an extraordinary career that spanned almost a quarter of a century.
- Bryant-Denny Stadium and Denny Chimes (located on the UA quadrangle) stand as reminders of Denny's legacy to the Capstone.
- In 1976, the State of Alabama Legislature and the UA Board of Trustees added coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's name to the stadium, thus calling Alabama's football home Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- Alabama's Sept. 2, 2006 season opener against Hawai'i drew a state-record 92,138 fans. The previous Bryant-Denny Stadium record was 86,869 on October 23, 1999, against Tennessee.

ALL-TIME TUSCALOOSA RECORD

- In addition to its impressive record at Bryant-Denny Stadium (1929-present), Alabama has made Tuscaloosa a very difficult place to play for opposing football teams.
- Alabama has compiled a 306-59-3 (.836) record in 368 games in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide captured their 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18, 2008, vs. Mississippi.
- Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893.
- From 1911-28, Alabama posted a 55-2 (.965) record in Tuscaloosa. The 1929 season marked the opening of what is now known as Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant posted a remarkable 72-2 (.973) record in Tuscaloosa, losing only to Florida (1963) and Southern Miss (1982). The USM game was the last game Bryant coached at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- From 1963-82, Alabama posted an NCAA record 57-game home winning streak.
- Miami has since broken that record with a 58-game home winning streak, but the Hurricanes' record also includes three wins in the post-season Orange Bowl game. All of UA's 57 wins were in the regular season.
- The 57-game winning streak is one of seven winning streaks longer than 15 games for the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.
- Alabama posted a 19-game unbeaten streak in Tuscaloosa from 1928-35.
