## GAME 11: ALABAMA (10-0, 7-0 SEC) vs. CHATTANOOGA (6-4, 4-4 SOUTHERN) SATURDAY, Nov. 21 • 11:21 A.M. • SEC NETWORK BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM (92,012) • TUSCALOOA, ALA.

**THE GAME:** The No. 2/3 University of Alabama football team returns home for its final non-conference game and final home game of the 2009 season on Saturday, November 21, against the Tennessee-Chattanooga Mocs. It will be the 11th meeting between the two schools, the first since 1994 and the first in Tuscaloosa in 50 years. The game is scheduled for an 11:21 a.m. kickoff at Bryant-Denny Stadium and will be televised by the SEC Network. Eli Gold, Phil Savage and Barry Krauss will have the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network. Alabama will also honor 26 seniors on Saturday prior to the start of the Tide's game against Chattanooga. (see complete list of seniors on page 11).

**HEAD COACH NICK SABAN:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) is in his third season with the Crimson Tide. He was named the school's 27th head coach on January 3, 2007. Saban has compiled a 120-50-1 (.705) record as a collegiate head coach with a 29-8 (.784) mark at Alabama that includes an 10-0 record this year with a 7-0 mark in the SEC. Saban has now won 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in his career. He captured his 100th career win and coached his 150th game as a collegiate head coach during the 2008 campaign. In 2003, Saban led LSU to a 13-1 record and the BCS National Championship. Overall, Saban has coached three conference championship teams (1990 Mid-American, 2001 SEC and 2003 SEC) and nine of his 12 teams have played in post-season bowl games with Alabama already bowl eligible this season. Saban is one of two (Bob Stoops) current Football Bowl Subdivision coaches to coach for at least 10 years and not suffer a losing season.

**RANKINGS:** The Crimson Tide is ranked No. 2 in the *Associated Press* poll, No. 2 in the BCS standings, No. 3 in the Harris Poll and No. 3 in the *USA Today* Coaches' poll this week following a 31-3 win at Mississippi State. Alabama has been ranked as high as No. 1 in the AP poll and No. 2 in the coaches' poll this season. UA garnered 14 first-place votes in the AP poll and seven in the coaches' poll this week. Alabama was ranked fifth in both the AP and *USA Today* Coaches' preseason polls. It was the highest preseason ranking for the Tide since the 2000 season when Alabama opened at No. 3.

**TENNESSEE-CHATTANOOGA SERIES:** The Crimson Tide will face Tennessee-Chattanooga in their final home game and final non-conference game of the 2009 season. Alabama has won all 10 games in the series against the Mocs, including a 7-0 record in Tuscaloosa and a 3-0 mark in Birmingham. The last meeting between the two schools was a 42-13 Crimson Tide win in 1994 at Legion Field in Birmingham. It is the first time in 50 years that Chattanooga will travel to Bryant-Denny Stadium, after falling to the Tide 13-0 in 1959.

**NEXT GAME:** The Crimson Tide travels across the state for the annual Iron Bowl against the Auburn Tigers at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Friday, Nov. 27, at 1:30 p.m. on CBS. It will be the 62nd consecutive meeting and the 74th overall meeting between the two teams. Alabama owns a 39-33-1 edge in the series that is the oldest in Crimson Tide annals, dating back to 1893. UA posted a 36-0 win over the Tigers a season ago in Tuscaloosa, but will be looking for their first win in Auburn since a 31-7 victory in 2001. Alabama is 2-7 in games played at Auburn, but owns a 34-18-1 record in Birmingham.

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama's success on the field over the past two-and-a-half seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with success in the classroom. An impressive total of 13 Crimson Tide players are playing this season with degrees already in hand, including Eryk Anders (Health Studies), Drew Davis (marketing), P.J. Fitzgerald (management), Mike Johnson (consumer affairs), Tyrone King (Health Studies), Greg McElroy (business marketing), Cory Reamer (finance), Chris Rogers (consumer affairs), Brian Selman (business marketing), Ali Sharrief (human environmental science), Travis Sikes (consumer affairs), Heath Thomas and Lorenzo Washington (human environmental science). McElroy finished his undergraduate degree in just three years with a 3.86 grade point average while graduating magna cum laude. Additionally, another 10 players are on track to graduate in December of 2009. In 2008, Alabama had six players with degrees already in hand.

**TIDE LEADS NATION IN GRADUATES:** Alabama's 13 graduates on the 2009 roster are the most of any school in the Bowl Championship Subdivision. The Crimson Tide is five graduates ahead of any other SEC school with Auburn checking in fifth with eight graduates. Boston College and Virginia Tech (the Tide's season-opening opponent) are tied for second with 10 graduates while Penn State is fourth with nine (see sidebar for complete list).

**BEATING THE BEST:** Alabama is 7-2 against the *Associated Press* Top 25 over the 2008 and 2009 seasons. The Crimson Tide's 24-15 win over No. 9 LSU last week was the Tide's fourth win over a top-10 team dating back to the start of the 2008 season. Alabama is 4-0 against the AP Top 25 in the 2009 season.

**INITIAL BCS RANKINGS RELEASED:** Alabama is ranked second in this week's Bowl Championship Series standings released on Sunday, Nov. 15. The Crimson Tide (.9521) trails No. 1 Florida (.9833) by a margin of .0312 with Texas in third at .9261. The Tide is ranked No. 3 in the Harris Interactive poll and the USA Today Coaches poll but is in second place in the average of all six computer rankings, while third-place Texas is fourth in the computers. TCU is fourth in the BCS with an average of 0.8685 with Cincinnati fifth (.8536).

**SABAN AMONG THE BEST:** Head coach Nick Saban's arrival in Tuscaloosa has seen his Crimson Tide vault up the national rankings. That success in such a short period of time has quickly impacted the Tide's record book. Saban produced the largest win increase from year one to year two in school history as Alabama went from seven wins in 2007 to 12 wins in 2008. He is one of two coaches (Bob Stoops, Oklahoma) in the Football Bowl Subdivision football to have coached 10 years and never suffered through a losing season. Saban achieved another first in 2009 with back-to-back 10-win seasons. He also ranks fourth in winning percentage (70.3 percent) among active coaches who have coached at least 10 years of Division I-A football.

## CRIMSON TIDE DEFENSIVE NOTES

**BAMA DEFENSE GETTING STRONGER:** Alabama's defense only seems to be strengthening down the stretch of the 2009 season. The Crimson Tide ranks second in scoring defense (10.90), rush defense (72.80) and pass efficiency defense (88.27) while third in total defense (239.30) and 11th in pass defense (166.50). UA has surrendered just six defensive touchdowns in seven Southeastern Conferences games this season and held five of those teams to single-digit points. They have also won six of their seven SEC games by two or more scores. Over the past five games those numbers get even better, allowing just three touchdowns and not allowing an opposing team to score more than 15 points in that stretch.

**DOMINANT 'D':** Alabama returned eight starters from a 2008 defense that finished third nationally in total defense, allowing just 263.5 yards per game. The 2009 unit has even better numbers, allowing a total of 239.30 yards per game in 10 outings to rank third nationally. The Tide held Virginia Tech to 155 total yards (64 rushing, 91 passing) while limiting Tech to 2-of-12 on third down conversions and racking up five sacks. UA held FIU to 214 total yards, including only one yard rushing while North Texas could only manage 187 yards of offense and 61 yards rushing. Arkansas gained 254 yards, but only managed 63 on the ground. The Tide limited No. 20 Mississippi to 197 total yards and just 57 rushing yards, including a mere 19 yards of total offense in the first half. UA then held No. 22 South Carolina to 64 yards rushing and just six points. LSU totaled 253 yards, but managed just 95 on the ground the its quarterbacks combined for a 105.82 passer rating and just 158 yards. Mississippi State could only muster 99 yards through the air and 213 total yards.

**AIR DEFENSE:** Alabama's defense has smothered almost every aspect of opponent offense in 2009, and while a lot of the attention goes to the Tide's suffocating rushing defense, Alabama has also limited some very dangerous passing attacks. The Tide boasts the nation's No. 3 overall defense, allowing just 239.30 yards per game, but Alabama also ranks second in the country in pass efficiency defense, surrendering a 88.27 opponent passer rating. The Tide is tied for 10th in interceptions (15) and ranks 11th in pass defense (166.50 ypg). Below is a game-by-game look at opponents' passing numbers in 2009.

**GROUND DEFENSE:** The Crimson Tide has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in an astonishing 30 games, dating back to Oct. 13, 2007, when Mississippi's BenJarvus Green-Ellis went for 131 yards. That is the longest streak in the nation, nine games more than second-place Ohio State (21 games). Alabama is one of six teams not to allow a 100-yard rusher in 2009 and they are the only team not to surrender a 100-yard rusher in 2008 or 2009. As a team, the Crimson Tide has held 20 teams under 100 yards rushing over the past 24 games with only LSU and Florida in 2008 and Kentucky and Mississippi State in 2009, able to crack the 100-yard barrier as a team.

## ALABAMA IN THE AP

Alabama has been ranked in 641 of the 1,001 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 382-128-10 all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including an 22-5 mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 25th consecutive game (including all 14 last season), its longest streak since the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 consecutive weeks under Coach Gene Stallings.

## UA IN THE COACHES' POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the last half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. The USA Today took over the poll in 1991 and has run the poll for the last 19 seasons. Alabama was ranked No. 5 in the 2009 preseason coaches' poll after not being ranked in last year's preseason poll. Alabama entered the rankings after beating Clemson and was ranked in the coaches poll for the remainder of the season, reaching No. 1 in the polls for five weeks in November. The Tide has five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and USA Today (1992) coaches poll national titles.

**STIFLING DEFENSE PUTTING UP IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS:** Alabama's defense over the past 24 games – or two seasons – has developed a reputation for its toughness, talent and pure speed, a reputation verified on the stat sheet. The Alabama defense has held opponents under 200 yards of total offense in nine games over the last two seasons, including a 155-yard effort by Virginia Tech, a 187-yard showing by North Texas and a 197-yard game by Mississippi in 2009. The sub-200-yard games in that span: Clemson (188); Western Kentucky (158); Tennessee (173); Arkansas State (158); Mississippi State (167); Auburn (170); Virginia Tech (155); North Texas (187); Mississippi (197).

**DEFENSE TOUGH ON THIRD DOWN:** The Crimson Tide defense has been strong on third down in 2009, ranking sixth nationally and allowing just a 29.08 conversion rate (14 for 141). Alabama's performance at Mississippi was something special. UA did not allow the Rebels a single third-down conversion as UM went 0 for 9. UA held Virginia Tech to just two conversions on 12 third down attempts (16.7 percent). Florida International was just 7 for 17 (41.1%) on third down while North Texas could only muster a success rate of 28.5 percent (4 for 14). The Tide opened SEC play by limiting Arkansas to 2 for 14 on third down (14.3 percent) and then held Kentucky to 4 of 13 (30.8 percent). No. 9 LSU converted just 5 of 14 (35.7 percent) in the Tide's 24-15 win and Mississippi State managed just a mere 15.4 percent conversion rate (2 for 13). That continues a trend for the Crimson Tide after finishing third nationally in third down conversion defense in 2008, holding opponents to a 28.14 percent (56 of 199) conversion rate.

**FORCING TURNOVERS:** Alabama has produced 16 turnovers in the last six games, forcing five turnovers at Mississippi, four at Kentucky, two against South Carolina, one vs. Tennessee, one vs. LSU and three at Mississippi State. The Tide has picked off 13 passes in those six games and recovered three fumbles. The Crimson Tide ranks eighth nationally in turnover margin at plus-1.00 per game. The Crimson Tide has forced 69 turnovers in the first 37 games under head coach Nick Saban, an average of 1.86 per game. The Crimson Tide has forced 20 turnovers in 10 games this season, while the UA offense has only turned the ball over 10 times (4 interception, 6 fumbles).

Alabama forced 24 turnovers in 2007 for a plus-4 turnover ratio and then recorded 25 turnovers and ended the season with a plus-6 turnover margin in 2008. Alabama has recorded at least one turnover in 32 of 37 games under Saban. UA is 26-6 under Saban when they have at least one turnover. Alabama is 3-2 in games without a turnover over the last three seasons.

**PASS RUSH IMPORTANT FOR BAMA DEFENSE:** The Alabama defense will be looking to get pressure on the Tennessee-Chattanooga quarterback in an effort to slow down the Mocs' passing attack. The UA defense exploded for five sacks in each of their first two games of the 2009 season and then tallied five more against South Carolina. The Tide has 28 on the season, which is two more sacks than the Tide recorded in 14 games last season. UA ranks 15th nationally while ranking second in the SEC in sacks with 2.80 per game. The Mocs' offensive line has surrendered an average of just .80 sacks per game to rank tied for fourth nationally in the Football Championship Subdivision. Defensive end Marcell Dareus leads the Tide and the SEC with .65 sacks per game (6.5) while Javier Arenas and Eryk Anders are second on the team with 4.0 and Rolando McClain has three sacks. UA also ranks tied for 16th nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 7.30 per game. That mark ranks also leads the Southeastern Conference and accounts for 359 lost yards by UA opponents. Arenas leads the Tide with 10.5 tackles for loss (-74) while McClain is second with 10.0 (-45 yards), Dareus is third with 8.5 and Anders is fourth with 8.0 (-56).

**McCLAIN HEART AND SOUL OF TIDE DEFENSE:** Junior middle linebacker Rolando McClain has proven to be the heart and soul of the Tide's defense and maybe the most complete linebacker in the country. He not only leads the team in tackles with 77, but is the on-field coach for Alabama. McClain is responsible for making all of the defensive calls and is especially proficient at checking the Crimson Tide into the correct play. Almost impossible to block, McClain is either making the tackle or forcing the play into the waiting arms of another Tide defender. The remainder of his stat line reads: 10.0 tackles for loss (-45 yards), 3.0 sacks (-26 yards), two interceptions (21 return yards), one pass breakup, eight quarterback hurries and a forced fumble. McClain's play has garnered him extensive national recognition. He was the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Kentucky. McClain has also been named a midseason All-American by *Sporting News* and selected as a semifinalist for the Lombardi and Butkus Awards as well as the Chuck Bednarik Award, which goes to the best defensive player in the nation.

**MARK BARRON MAKING PRESENCE KNOWN:** Alabama's sophomore safety Mark Barron might not be the first safety to come across the minds of the national media, but the Mobile, Ala., native is making a strong bid for first-team All-SEC recognition and maybe more. Barron is tied for third nationally while leading the SEC with six interceptions. He also has 60 tackles to rank second on the Alabama team, which ranks in the top three of almost every defensive category in the nation. Barron is tied for the SEC lead in passes defended with teammate Marquis Johnson with 15 (9 PBU, 6 INT). The 1.50 passes defended per game is also tied for third nationally.

**DAREUS MAKES A NAME FOR HIMSELF:** Following an exceptional fall camp, sophomore defensive lineman Marcell Dareus has been dominant in 2009. He has 27 tackles on the season with 8.5 tackles for loss (-48) and 6.5 sacks (-44) to rank fourth in the Southeastern Conference and tied for 41st nationally. Dareus had a breakout game in the season opener against Virginia Tech with two total tackles, including 1.5 sacks, as he harassed Tech signal-caller Tyrod Taylor into 9-of-20 passing for just 91 yards. He followed that up with a four-tackle outing against FIU during which he posted two sacks for 17 yards in losses. Dareus had two solo stops vs. Arkansas with a tackle for loss (-1). He then recorded a sack, four tackles and a pass breakup in a hard-fought win over Tennessee before notching two more sacks in a win over No. 9 LSU.

**DEADERICK UNDAUNTED:** Senior defensive tackle Brandon Deaderick completed a miraculous return to the playing field with an appearance in the Crimson Tide's win over Virginia Tech, just five days after being shot by an unknown assailant on Monday night, August 31, in Tuscaloosa. Deaderick, who suffered non-life threatening injuries to his left forearm and hip in the incident, was cleared for action by team doctors. He saw his first action on special teams with 6:35 left to play in the first quarter on Virginia Tech's point-after conversion following a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown that tied the game at 6-6. Deaderick saw action on defense with 3:00 left in the first quarter. He finished with one solo tackle vs. the Hokies. He has played in all 10 games this season with six starts. He has accounted for 16 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

## CRIMSON TIDE OFFENSIVE NOTES

**AT HIS BEST, AGAINST THE BEST:** Mark Ingram has been at his best against the best in 2009. The sophomore has rolled up 1,522 all-purpose yards and 13 touchdowns while averaging 129.70 yards per game on the ground with 10 rushing touchdowns in 10 games. But those numbers climb even higher when the Crimson Tide's opponent is ranked in the top 25. In Alabama's four games with top-25 opponents - including two in the top 10 - Ingram has accounted for 712 yards on the ground (178.0 ypg) with three rushing touchdowns. He has also caught 13 passes for 104 yards and a touchdown to account for 831 all-purpose yards (203.25 ypg) in those four contests. Ingram broke free for 150 rushing yards and a touchdown while catching three passes for 35 yards and a score in the season-opener against Virginia Tech. He then scampered for 172 yards on the ground, including a 36-yard touchdown run on fourth down at Mississippi. Ingram then exploded for a Bryant-Denny Stadium record 246 yards and a game-clinching touchdown vs. South Carolina and then pounded out 144 yards with five receptions for 30 yards vs. No. 9 LSU. The Tide's games against ranked opponents are also when he has best displayed his hard-to-tackle running style that has led to 484 total yards after contact (121.0 ypg) in those four games, including 115 yards vs. Virginia Tech, 95 yards after contact at Mississippi, 167 yards against South Carolina and 107 after contact against No. 9 LSU.

**INGRAM OFF TO THE RACES:** Sophomore Mark Ingram is producing a 2009 season that should put him at or near the top of the list for the Doak Walker Award, which goes to the nation's top running back and in the hunt for the Heisman Trophy. He has rushed for 1,297 yards and 10 touchdowns in 10 games this season for 129.70 yards per game average to rank fifth nationally and first in the SEC in rushing. Ingram has also added 25 receptions for 225 yards and three scores. Below is a look at Ingram's season on a game-by-game case.

**INGRAM EXPLOSIVE ...:** Mark Ingram has burst onto the scene for the Crimson Tide as a sophomore in 2009. He ranks second in the nation with 41 rushes of 10 or more yards this season and has nine receptions of 10 or more yards for a total of 50. Of Ingram's 219 touches (199 rushes, 25 receptions), almost a quarter (22.8 percent) have went for at least 10 yards. He ripped off an impressive eight runs and one reception of 10 or more yards against South Carolina, including five runs and one reception of 20 or more yards. He also had six runs and one reception of 10 yards or more vs. LSU's tough defense. Ingram also has 26 runs of 15 yards or more and 15 runs of 20 yards or more. Those big runs have also shown in Ingram's 6.69 yards per carry, which leads the Southeastern Conference and ranks fourth nationally among rushers with at least 150 carries. Fresno State's Ryan Matthews is first with 7.00 yards per carry on 213 attempts.

**AND TOUGH:** Mark Ingram has also proven difficult to bring down on first contact. He has gained an astonishing 812 yards after contact this season on 219 touches (194 rushes, 25 receptions). He has gained 53.4 percent of his total yards after contact this season (812 of 1,522). Ingram reeled off a season-best 167 total yards after contact against South Carolina on 24 rushes and two receptions. He also broke the 100-yard barrier on yards after contact vs. Virginia Tech (115) and LSU (107) and got close at Mississippi (95) yards after contact. Below is a breakdown of Ingram's yards after contact (both rushing and receiving) this season.

**INGRAM NOW 6TH ON ALABAMA'S SINGLE-SEASON RUSHING LIST:** Mark Ingram rushed for 149 yards against Mississippi State, giving him 1,297 rushing yards this season. With his totals, Ingram has moved into sixth place on the Alabama single-season rushing list. He is just 87 yards from moving into second place at the Capstone and 174 yards behind single-season leader Bobby Humphrey.

**INGRAM ON PACE:** Alabama sophomore running back Mark Ingram has already turned in a big season for the Crimson Tide. His 129.7 yards per game currently ranks fifth in the country and he is on pace to rush for 1,816 yards in a 14-game season (SEC Championship and bowl game). That number would shatter the school single-season mark of 1,471 by Bobby Humphrey in 1986 and rank as the third-most rushing yards in a single season in SEC history. It would only trail only Georgia's Herschel Walker (1,891) and Arkansas Darren McFadden (1,830). And, he would do it in less carries than any running back in the top 10.

**BALL SECURITY:** Mark Ingram has also developed an impressive reputation during his 24-game Alabama career as an expert at holding onto the football. The sophomore has lost only one fumble in 337 career rushing attempts and 32 career receptions for a total of 369 career touches. He has only put the ball on the ground twice (at LSU in 2008 and vs. Tennessee in 2009), the first of which was recovered by the Tide and a lost fumble vs. Tennessee this season. Ingram went 332 carries into his career before losing his first fumble. He has 2,025 rushing yards in those 24 games with 22 rushing touchdowns while also catching 32 passes for 279 yards and three scores.

**TOP RUSHING EFFORT IN BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM:** Sophomore running back Mark Ingram constructed a career-best rushing performance with 246 yards on 24 attempts against South Carolina on Oct. 17 – the third-highest single-game rushing total in Alabama history and the most in the history of Bryant-Denny Stadium. Ingram’s signature drive of the season also came against the Gamecocks, as he carried the ball on all six plays of the Tide final touchdown drive that sealed the game. Five of the plays came out of the ‘Wildcat’ formation with the runs covering 24, 4, 5, 9, 22 and 4 yards (TD). The yardage exceeded Ingram’s 172-yard outing at Mississippi, his previous career high.

**INGRAM RECEIVES HEISMAN ATTENTION:** Mark Ingram’s 246-yard rushing effort against South Carolina that included a six-play, 68-yard, game-clinching touchdown drive has people talking about the sophomore and the Heisman Trophy. Ingram has topped the last three HeismanPundit.com polls and ESPN’s Heisman Watch. HeismanPundit.com features 13 Heisman voters from across the country voting for their top five each week. The Nov. 10 poll had the Tide’s Ingram in front of Houston Case Keenum by 26 points (55 to 29) with Ingram receiving nine first-place votes and third-place Colt McCoy getting two (28 total points). ESPN’s Heisman Watch (Nov. 10), which polls 15 experts from across the nation, has Ingram with 65 total points and 10 first-place votes. No other player in the ESPN.com poll had more than two first-place votes.

**INGRAM SCORES ON CAREER-LONG RUN:** Sophomore running back Mark Ingram’s 70-yard touchdown run with 7:24 left in the fourth quarter sealed Alabama’s win over Mississippi State. It also stands as the longest run of Ingram’s Alabama career (previous long: 54 yards versus South Carolina on October 17, 2009).

**MARK INGRAM BREAKDOWN:** Below is a further breakdown of sophomore running back Mark Ingram’s 2009 season for the Crimson Tide as the sophomore continues to trend upward.

**Ingram vs. SEC Teams:** Ingram has rushed for exactly 1,000 yards (150 attempts) in seven SEC games this season. He is averaging 142.9 yards per game in SEC play with seven rushing touchdowns. He has accounted for 73.2 percent of the team’s rushing total in league play (1,000 of 1,366) and has scored seven of the team’s eight rushing touchdowns. Ingram has five 100-yard games in SEC play this season against Kentucky, Mississippi, South Carolina, LSU and Mississippi State. He finished with a career-high 246 yards vs. No. 22 South Carolina and then busted loose on a career-long 70-yard touchdown run at Mississippi State on Nov. 14.

**Ingram on the Road:** In four games away from Bryant-Denny Stadium, vs. Virginia Tech (Atlanta), at Kentucky, Mississippi and Mississippi State, Ingram is averaging 152.8 rushing yards per game this season. He has gained 611 yards in those contests on 95 carries for a 6.42 yards per carry average and six touchdowns.

**Ingram in September:** Ingram averaged 86.8 rushing yards in four games in September in limited action. He missed the start and most of the second half of the Tide’s win over Florida International with the flu. He then missed almost all of the second half and only received eight carries in a 53-7 blowout win over North Texas. Ingram also missed most of the fourth quarter against Arkansas after the Tide built a 35-7 lead.

**Ingram in October:** Ingram had a breakout month in October, averaging 164.2 rushing yards per game against four SEC opponents. He had 92 rushing attempts for 657 yards and four touchdowns for a 7.1 yards per carry average. Ingram tallied three 100-yard rushing games and had 99 yards in win over Tennessee while averaging 175.5 all-purpose yards per game.

**Ingram in November:** In two games this month, Ingram has 41 rushing attempts for 293 yards and two TDs in wins over LSU and Mississippi State. He is averaging 7.1 yards per carry and 146.5 yards per game in those two games. He ran for 144 yards in the Tide’s SEC Western Division-clinching win over No. 9 LSU on Nov. 7 and added 149 rushing yards - with a 70-yard run - and two touchdowns at Mississippi State on Nov. 14.

**A BALANCED ATTACK:** Alabama made its name a season ago with a punishing ground attack that wore down defenses and took shots down the field. In 2009, the Tide has brought more balance to the table. UA still has an outstanding ground game and an aerial attack to match with quarterback Greg McElroy. The Tide has shown good balance in their offensive numbers, averaging 216.90 rushing yards (13th nationally) and 200.70 yards passing (83rd nationally) per game, which gives UA the No. 29 total offense in the nation (417.60 ypg). On the ground, Alabama is rushing the ball an average of 40.6 times per game for 5.30 yards per rush. The passing game is averaging 26.8 pass attempts per contest for an average of 7.49 yards per attempt. Those numbers are leading to points on the scoreboard. UA averaged 30.1 points per game last season and is averaging 30.9 points per game in 2009 to rank 31st nationally.

**MCELROY ON THE MARK:** Greg McElroy has been impressive in his first 10 games as the Crimson Tide's starting quarterback, completing 60.2 percent (153 of 254) of his passes for 1,913 yards and 13 touchdowns with only four interceptions. The junior boasts a 137.24 passing efficiency rating, which ranks 40th nationally and sixth in the SEC. He has won his last 26 starts at quarterback, going 16-0 as a high school senior in 2005 and 10-0 for the Tide in 2009. In his collegiate starting debut against Virginia Tech, the Southlake, Texas, native threw for 230 yards on 15-of-30 passing with one touchdown and one interception in leading the Crimson Tide to a win over the No. 7 team in the country. He also set a new Alabama record for consecutive completions against FIU by connecting on 14 straight passes. Then against North Texas, he tied the school mark for highest completion percentage with a minimum of 10 completions, going 13 for 15 (86.7 percent).

**RICHARDSON HAS IMPRESSIVE ROOKIE CAMPAIGN:** True freshman running back Trent Richardson has enjoyed an impressive rookie season. The Pensacola, Fla., native has rushed for 451 yards and four touchdowns on just 91 attempts. He is averaging 5.0 yards per carry and 45.1 yards per game. He rushed for 118 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries against FIU in just his second career game. He followed that up with 87 yards on 11 carries (7.9 ypc) against North Texas and 65 yards and a score vs. Arkansas. Richardson scored on runs of nine and 35 yards in the second half vs. FIU, plunged in from one-yard out against North Texas and then broke five tackles en route to a 52-yard touchdown vs. Arkansas.

**MULTIPLE OPTIONS CREATE DIVERSE OFFENSIVE ATTACK:** One of the keys for the Tide's high-powered offense in 2009 has been its ability to find playmakers all over the field. UA quarterbacks, led by starter Greg McElroy, have completed 60.8 percent of their passes to an impressive 17 different receivers in the first 10 games of the 2009 season. That includes the SEC opener against Arkansas where McElroy spread out 17 completions to nine different receiving targets. The UA receiving numbers are headed by preseason All-America wide out Julio Jones, who has 28 receptions for 397 yards, a 14.2 yards per catch average and three touchdowns. Running back Mark Ingram is tied with Marquis Maze with 25 catches. Ingram has three receiving touchdowns and 225 yards while Maze has a team-best 423 yards and two touchdowns. Next is tight end Colin Peek is next with 19 grabs for 213 yards and one touchdown. Junior Darius Hanks follows (16 catches, 257 yards & 3 TDs) In all, the Tide has 83 receptions from its wide receivers, 47 from backs, 31 from tight ends and one from safety Mark Barron on a fake punt.

**DIVERSE SCORING:** The Alabama offense has been able to score in a hurry while also showing the ability to grind out the long, time-consuming scoring drive. The Crimson Tide has scored 18 touchdowns in three minutes or less, including 11 that found the end zone in three or less plays. On the flip side, Alabama has grinded out 11 scoring drives (eight touchdowns & three field goals) that have included 10 or more plays and 5:00 of possession time. The Tide has logged five touchdowns that have consisted of at least 13 plays. Alabama has also pounded out nine drives of 80 yards or more, including three drives of 95 yards or more (99, 97 & 95).

**TIME OF POSSESSION:** An Alabama trademark over the past two seasons has been its ability to control the line of scrimmage offensively and, consequently, control the tempo of the game. This has played out with an impressive advantage in time of possession. A year ago the Crimson Tide finished 11th nationally with an average time of possession of 32:08. In 2009, the Crimson Tide is off to another great start

in that category, ranking 10th nationally at 32:32. The Tide held the ball for 37:02 in the opener against Virginia Tech and then a season-best 38:19 at Mississippi. UA also won possession time against Florida International (31:38), North Texas (30:43), Arkansas (33:36), Kentucky (33:30), LSU (32:52) and Mississippi State (31:36). The Tide has won the time of possession battle in 17 of the last 24 games overall and eight-of-10 contests in 2009.

**BAMA SCORES ON BIG PLAYS:** On the year, the Alabama offense has 45 plays of 20 yards or more with 17 of those plays going for touchdowns. The Tide also has 18 plays of 35 yards or more with 12 of those going to scores.

**ALABAMA'S 53 POINTS:** The Crimson Tide's 53 points in its win over North Texas were the most during head coach Nick Saban's tenure at the Capstone. The previous high of 52 came on Sept. 1, 2007, against Western Carolina in his first game at Alabama. Additionally, the 53 points are the most scored by Alabama since beating UTEP, 56-7, on Oct. 6, 2001, at Legion Field in Birmingham. The 53 points are the most at Bryant-Denny Stadium since a 62-0 win over Tulane on Oct. 12, 1991.

**100-YARD RUSHERS AND RECEIVERS:** Alabama has had seven 100-yard rushers and two 100-yard receiver in its 10 games this season. Sophomore running back Mark Ingram ran for 150 yards in the Tide's 34-24 win over Virginia Tech in the season opener on Sept. 5. One week later, freshman Trent Richardson led the Tide with 118 rushing yards and senior WR Mike McCoy recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game in a win over FIU (5-100-1). Ingram has also recorded at least 100 yards in five of his last six games, only missing the 100-yard mark vs. Tennessee with 99 yards. He had 140 yards at Kentucky, 172 yards at Mississippi and then a career-best and Bryant-Denny Stadium record 246 yards against South Carolina. Ingram then went for 144 against No. 9 LSU and 149 and two scores at Mississippi State. Under Coach Saban, Alabama has had 17 100-yard rushing games and the Tide has gone 16-1 in those 17 games. Four different players have rushed for 100 yards during the last three seasons. Under Coach Saban, Alabama has had eight 100-yard receiving performances and the Tide has gone 7-1 in those games. The LSU game on Nov. 7 marked the fourth time under Coach Saban that Alabama had a 100-yard rusher and receiver in the same game.

**30-PLUS:** For the first time since 1979, and just the third time in school history, Alabama opened the season with five straight games of 30 points or more. The Tide also accomplished the feat in 1920. It was just the seventh time in school history Alabama had five consecutive games of 30 points or more with the most recent being the season-opening streak in 1979. The longest such streak is seven games, which came from Sept. 18 - Oct. 30 in 1971. The 1971 team also set the school record for most 30-point games with nine. Alabama had seven (tied for third) in 2008 and has six this season. In 2009, the Tide opened with 34 points against Virginia Tech, scored 40 vs. FIU and the hung 53 against North Texas - the most points for a UA team since 2001. The Crimson Tide then put up 35 points in the SEC opener against Arkansas and followed that with 38 points on the road at Kentucky. Alabama then posted a 31-3 win at Mississippi State on Nov. 14

## CRIMSON TIDE SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**ARENAS NEARING SEC & NCAA PUNT RETURN YARDAGE RECORD:** Senior cornerback and return specialist Javier Arenas is quickly sneaking up on the all-time great punt returners in college football history. He has already broken all of the Crimson Tide punt return records, and now has his sights set on the SEC and NCAA records as well. He is the NCAA active leader in career punt returns, yards, touchdowns, returns per game and yards per game. Arenas, who has 1,590 career punt return yards on 117 returns, is just 106 punt return yards away from breaking Lee Nalley's long-standing SEC record of 1,695 (102 returns for a 14.4 ypr average). Nalley set that record from 1947-49 and it stood for 54 years as the NCAA record until Texas Tech's Wes Welker broke it in 2003. Welker finished his Tech career with 1,761 punt return yards and Arenas needs 172 yards to break his record and become the NCAA's all-time leader in punt return yards.

**TIFFIN'S PRODUCTION AT ALL-TIME HIGH:** Alabama senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin leads the nation in field goals per game at 2.40. He has connected on 24-of-27 field goals this season (88.9 percent). His 24 field goals are one shy of his own school record of 25 set in 2007 and currently rank as the seventh most by any SEC kicker in a single season. Tiffin also leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally in scoring at 10.10 points per game. He has scored 101 points this season, which is third-highest single-season total at UA, trailing his 2007 season (111 points) and his 2008 season (106 points). Tiffin has connected on nine consecutive field goals and 18 of his last 20. He has made an impressive 15 field (out of 16) over the last five games.

**TIFFIN BECOMES UA'S CAREER SCORING LEADER:** Leigh Tiffin became Alabama's career scoring leader on Nov. 7 with 10 points vs. LSU, passing Philip Doyle (345). He now has 354 career points to rank fifth in SEC history. He is 14 points behind Florida's Jeff Chandler for fourth place. Tiffin passed his father, Van (312), for third place on the Tide's all-time in the career list earlier this season and then passed Michael Proctor (325) vs. Tennessee.

**TIFFIN NO. 2 ON UA'S CAREER FIELD GOALS LIST:** Senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin keeps inching closer to the Alabama career field goals made record. He converted his only field goal chance - from 39 yards out - at Mississippi State to give him 77 for his career, which is second all-time at Alabama and one back of Philip Doyle (78 from 1987-90). Tiffin connected on multiple field goals in four straight games prior to the MSU game. He has made 15 of 16 field goals during the last five games. He surpassed his father, Van Tiffin (59 from 1983-86) earlier this season against North Texas and then moved past Michael Proctor vs. Mississippi. He is also fourth on the SEC's career field goals made list, just 10 behind Georgia's Billy Bennett (87) and tied for third in SEC history.

**TIFFIN GARNERS NATIONAL ATTENTION:** Senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin keeps making big field goals and the Crimson Tide keeps winning. He leads the nation in field goals per game at 2.40 and total field goals with 24, which ranks as the second-most in a single season in school history. Tiffin also ranks sixth nationally and first in the SEC in scoring with 10.44 points per game. His 94 total points is tied for the sixth highest in a single season at Alabama, just 17 points behind his record set in 2007. He has been named a Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" three times and was a midseason All-American by CBSsports.com. Those numbers should have him in the running for first-team All-America honors and the Lou Gorza Award, which goes to the nation's top place-kicker.

## ACCOLADES/WATCH LISTS/ HONORS

**UA COACHES PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** The Alabama coaching staff recognized seven players of the week following a 31-3 win at Mississippi State. Mark Ingram and Mike Johnson were selected as the offensive honorees while Rolando McClain, Mark Barron and Cory Reamer were selected for their defensive efforts. Javier Arenas and Robby Green garnered special teams accolades.

Johnson cleared a path for Ingram to collect his sixth 100-yard rushing game of the season. Johnson also led an offensive line that did not surrender a sack and allowed just three quarterback hurries. Ingram finished with 149 yards on just 19 carries for an impressive 7.84 yards per carry average. He ripped off the longest run of his career with a 70-yard touchdown burst in the fourth quarter. He also scored on a one-yard plunge in the second stanza.

McClain garnered his sixth defensive player of the week accolade this season with 11 total stops, including nine solo tackles. He also logged his third sack of the season and totaled three tackles for loss (-17 yards). Barron picked off his fifth and sixth passes of the season to lead the SEC and rank tied for third nationally. He also made six tackles with four solo stops and two more pass breakups. Reamer made seven tackles with five solo stops, a sack (-11 yards) and two TFL (-14 yards).

Arenas returned two kickoffs for 70 yards with a long of 46 yards, which set up an second-half touchdown for the Tide. Green made two special teams tackles to lead the Tide's coverage units.

**INGRAM/CODY RECEIVE ATT&T PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS:** In back-to-back weeks (South Carolina and Tennessee), Alabama players won the AT&T All-America Player of the Week Award. The AT&T All-America Player of the Week is the only player of the week award voted on solely by the fans. Ingram rushed for a Bryant-Denny Stadium record 246 yards and a touchdown against South Carolina and Cody followed that with two blocked field goals in the fourth quarter against Tennessee to preserve the win. The second blocked field goal came with four seconds remaining and clinched a 12-10 Crimson Tide win.

**MORE SEC HONORS:** Mike Johnson is the latest Alabama player to receive SEC Player of the Week honors, earning offensive lineman of the week accolades after the Tide's 252 yards rushing and no sacks allowed at Mississippi State. Javier Arenas was honored after the win over LSU as the defensive player of the week when he made seven total tackles (four solos), with two for losses (-8 yards) and a quarterback pressure. Seniors Leigh Tiffin and Terrence Cody were honored by the SEC following the Tennessee game. Tiffin was selected as the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week after successfully converting all four field goal attempts and accounting for all 12 points in the win over Tennessee. Tiffin made kicks of 38, 50, 22 and 49 yards. Tiffin has made 11 field goals in the last three games against Mississippi (5-for-5), South Carolina (2-for-3) and Tennessee (4-for-4). Cody was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after his two blocked field attempts, including one of the game's final play that secured the Crimson Tide's 12-10 victory over the Vols. Cody blocked Daniel Lincoln's 44-yard field goal attempt on the game's final play as the Tide improved to 8-0 this season. Cody also blocked a 43-yard field goal attempt earlier in the fourth quarter, tying the Alabama single-game record for blocked kicks in a game. He was also credited with two tackles in the win.

For the season, Alabama has seen eight players earn 10 SEC Player of the Week honors. Mark Ingram has received offensive player of the week honors twice, following the Virginia Tech and South Carolina games while fellow running back Trent Richardson was recognized as the freshman of the week following the FIU and Arkansas games. Rolando McClain was honored after the Kentucky game when he made 12 tackles, forced a fumble that was returned for a touchdown and intercepted a pass. Junior center William Vlachos was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following the Tide's win at Mississippi.

**INGRAM PICKED AS DOAK WALKER SEMIFINALIST:** Alabama sophomore running back Mark Ingram has been selected as one of 10 semifinalists for the 2009 Doak Walker Award. It is the second straight season Alabama has had a Doak Walker Award semifinalist (Glen Coffee). In 10 games this season, Ingram has 1,297 yards and 10 touchdowns on the ground. He leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Ingram has added 25 receptions for 225 yards and three touchdowns, giving him 13 total touchdowns and 1,522 all-purpose yards. He tied Shaun Alexander as the fastest player in school history to reach 1,000 yards, accomplishing the feat in just eight games.

**MCCLAIN NAMED A LOTT IMPACT TROPHY SEMIFINALIST:** Crimson Tide junior linebacker Rolando McClain in one of eight semifinalists for the 2009 Lott Impact Trophy the Pacific Club Impact Foundation announced earlier this week. The award, which is named for NFL Hall of Famer Ronnie Lott, is presented to college football's defensive IMPACT Player of the Year. The award is presented to the player who best exhibits the same characteristics Lott embodied during his distinguished career: Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity. The winning school will receive \$25,000 for their general scholarship fund. Former Alabama linebacker and current Houston Texans standout DeMeco Ryans won the award in 2006. Alabama ranks in the top three nationally in almost every defensive category. The four finalists will be announced Nov. 24 and the winner will be announced Dec. 13 at the Lott Trophy Banquet in Newport Beach, Calif.

**CODY SELECTED AS LOMBARDI FINALIST:** Alabama nose guard Terrence Cody is one of four finalists for the 40th Rotary Lombardi Award, which goes to the nation's top interior lineman or linebacker. Cody joins TCU defensive end Jerry Hughes, Oklahoma defensive end Gerald McCoy and Nebraska defensive tackle Ndamukong Suh as this year's finalists. Cody is the seventh Tide player to be named a finalist for the Lombardi Award and the second in a row, after Andre Smith in 2008. Former All-American linebacker Cornelius Bennett is the only UA player to win the Lombardi Award, capturing the honor in 1986. Cody has anchored an Alabama defensive front that has held opponents to 72.8 rushing yards per game, a figure that ranks second nationally. He has recorded 20 tackles, including five tackles for loss (-20 yards), while constantly going against double-teams. He has also added two blocked kicks, two quarterback pressures and one pass breakup.

**INGRAM SELECTED AS MAXWELL AWARD SEMIFINALIST:** Mark Ingram was named one of 16 semifinalists for the 73rd Maxwell Award this week, given annually to the best player in college football. Ingram and Florida quarterback Tim Tebow are the only two SEC players to be named semifinalists for the Maxwell Award. Ingram leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally with 129.7 rushing yards per game this season and 178.0 yards against teams ranked in the top 25.

**MCCLAIN AND CODY NAMED SEMIFINALISTS FOR BEDNARIK AWARD:** Rolando McClain, a junior linebacker from Decatur, Ala., and Terrence Cody, a senior nose guard from Ft. Myers, Fla., were among the 16 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award, given to the best defensive player in college football. McClain and Cody were among six SEC players named to the Bednarik Award list.

**JAVIER ARENAS TABBED AS SEMIFINALIST FOR THORPE AWARD:** Alabama senior cornerback Javier Arenas was named one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award. Arenas is one of three SEC players among the semifinalists. The finalists will be announced Nov. 23 and the winner will be named at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show on Dec. 10 in Orlando, Fla.

**PEEK AND JONES EARN CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS:** Alabama tight end Colin Peek and offensive lineman Barrett Jones were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District IV Team this week. Peek sports a 3.79 grade point average in finance and is set to graduate in December. The senior has started eight games this season and has 19 catches for 213 yards (11.2 yards per catch) and one touchdown. He was a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Honor Roll in 2006, 2007 and 2008 at Georgia Tech. Once Peek transferred to Alabama, he was honored on the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll in 2009. Jones boasts a 4.0 grade point average in management and has started all nine games for the Crimson Tide this season at right guard. He has been an integral part of the Tide's rushing success this season with the Crimson Tide averaging 213.00 rushing yards per game to rank 14th nationally. The Tide's offensive line also ranks 12th nationally in fewest sacks allowed at 1.00 per game. He was a member of the 2009 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll and has been selected to the President's List in 2008 and 2009 with a 4.0 gpa.

**MCCLAIN EARNS NATIONAL HONOR:** Alabama linebacker Rolando McClain was named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Kentucky. McClain, a 6-4, 258-pound junior from Decatur, Ala., registered a game- and season-high 12 tackles (eight unassisted) made his first interception of the 2009 season, forced a fumble that was returned for a touchdown, notched a quarterback hurry and recorded a pass deflection in Alabama's 38-20 victory. McClain's forced fumble led to a 45-yard touchdown return that gave the Crimson Tide a 21-6 halftime lead. Then, his 21-yard interception return on the first possession of the third quarter set up another Alabama touchdown. His third-quarter pass deflection resulted in an interception that led to a field goal.

**SPORTING NEWS' MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS:** *Sporting News* released its midseason All-Americans this week with four Alabama Crimson Tide players among the 26-man team. The Tide's top-ranked defense featured standout linebacker Rolando McClain along with senior nose guard Terrence Cody. Sophomore running back Mark Ingram and senior left guard Mike Johnson were tabbed on offense.

**MCCLAIN LOTT IMPACT POW:** Alabama junior linebacker Rolando McClain was selected as the Lott Trophy IMPACT Player of the Week following the Tide's 20-6 win over No. 22 South Carolina. The Decatur, Ala., native had seven tackles, two quarterback pressures, one tackle for loss (-2 yards) and one pass breakup in the Crimson Tide's win.

**PEEK ON MACKIEY WATCH LIST:** Alabama senior tight end Colin Peek was one of 22 players named to the 2009 John Mackey Award Watch List, the Nassau County Sports Commission has announced. The Mackey Award is given annually to best collegiate tight end and the winner will be announced on Dec. 10. Peek has started eight games and played in nine for the top-ranked Crimson Tide and has caught a team-high 19 passes for 213 yards (11.2 per catch) and one touchdown this season. Peek's blocking skills have paved the way for sophomore running back Mark Ingram's SEC-leading 129.7 rushing yards per game this season, and 10 touchdowns. In addition, the Crimson Tide offense churns out 216.90 rushing yards per game to rank 13th nationally and third in the SEC.

**STAR OF THE WEEK:** Senior place-kicker Leigh Tiffin has become accustomed to being named the Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week." He was selected for the award for the third time this season after nailing four field goals and accounting for all of Alabama's points in a 12-10 win over Tennessee. He connected on kicks of 38, 50, 22 and 49 yards in the win. He was also named the Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" for his efforts in the Crimson Tide's 22-3 win at Mississippi on

Oct. 10, when he kicked a career-best five field goals in the win. His first "Star of the Week" recognition this season came at Virginia Tech where he connected on 4-of-5 field goals and two extra points. Tiffin was also named a Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" twice in 2008.

**TIDE PLAYERS EARN EARLY ACCOLADES:** Eight Alabama players were named to 11 different preseason awards watch lists prior to the 2009 season. The players were recognized as potentially the top players at their position nationally.

Both Rolando McClain and Terrence Cody appeared on five watch lists. McClain is on the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award (best defensive player), Dick Butkus Award (top linebacker), Lombardi Trophy (top lineman or linebacker), Lott Trophy (best defensive player) and Nagurski Trophy (defensive player of the year). As a sophomore, McClain led the Tide with 95 tackles and 12 tackles for loss. Cody is also up for the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Trophy, Lott Trophy, Nagurski Award and Outland Trophy. Last year as a junior, Cody recorded 24 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and recovered two fumbles for the Tide. Other defensive players on preseason awards lists included Arenas (Nagurski and Thorpe) and Hightower (Butkus and Lombardi).

The Crimson Tide offense was represented by Mark Ingram, Mike Johnson and Julio Jones. Jones appears on the Biletnikoff Award (best receiver) and Maxwell Trophy (player of the year), while Johnson is on both the Lombardi and Outland watch lists for outstanding linemen. Ingram appears on the Doak Walker Award list, presented the nation's top running back. Last year as a freshman, Ingram ran for 712 yards and a freshman record 12 touchdowns. Senior Leigh Tiffin was named to the Lou Groza Award list, which is given to the nation's top place kicker. (see sidebar on page 7 for complete list)

**FRESHMAN ACADEMICS:** Alabama's heralded 2008 freshman class did more than just excel on the football field, the Crimson Tide placed 12 rookies on the 2009 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, by far the highest total in the SEC with Georgia coming in second with seven honorees. The Tide's freshmen academic honorees were Undra Billingsley, John Michael Boswell, Jerrell Harris, Mark Ingram, Barrett Jones, Chris Jordan, Tyler Love, Wesley Neighbors, Brad Smelley, Corey Smith, Damion Square and Michael Williams. Each student-athlete must have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or above and be on scholarship or a letter winner. They also must completed 24 semester hours of non-remedial credit at the nominating institution and have been a member of the varsity team for the sport's entire NCAA Championship segment.

**10-WIN SEASONS:** The win over Mississippi State improves Alabama's 2009 season record to 10-0 and gives the Crimson Tide its 30th 10-win season in 115 seasons of football. Alabama's 30 10-win seasons ranks second in college football behind Oklahoma, which has reached the 10-win plateau 31 times. It is the fourth time this decade in which Alabama has had 10 wins in a season (2002, 2005, 2008 and 2009). Alabama head coach Nick Saban is the 11th coach in school history to lead his team to a 10-win season. In addition, Saban is the fifth coach in school history to have more than one 10-win season. Saban led the Crimson Tide to a 12-2 record last season.

**TIDES HAS 10-GAME STREAK FOR 22nd TIME IN HISTORY:** The win over Mississippi State on Nov. 14 gives the Crimson Tide a 10-game winning streak, the 22nd winning streak of 10 or more games in school history, an NCAA record. The last time UA owned a 10-game winning streak came during the 2007-08 seasons when UA reeled off 13 consecutive wins. That streak began with a 30-24 win over Colorado in the 2007 Independence Bowl and continued through the 2008 regular season. The streak ended with a 31-20 loss to Florida in the 2008 SEC Championship Game.

**ALABAMA SECOND NATIONALLY IN WINS OVER LAST TWO YEARS:** Alabama has won 22 games over the past two seasons, which is tied for the second most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games a season ago and has followed that with a perfect 10-0 record in 2009. Florida leads the nation with 23 wins over the past two years, while Boise State and Texas join Alabama with 22 victories. It is the first time since the 1991 (11 wins) and 1992 (13 wins) seasons that the Crimson Tide has won at least a combined 22 games in back-to-back seasons.

**FIRST CONSECUTIVE 10-0 STARTS SINCE 1973-74:** The victory over Mississippi State moves Alabama to 10-0 for the season. Along with a 12-0 start in 2008, this marks the first time since the 1973 and 1974 seasons that Alabama has constructed 10-0 starts in consecutive seasons. Alabama, which finished 12-2 in 2008, finished 11-1 in both 1973 and 1974 as the Crimson Tide won 11 straight games prior to losing bowl games in those seasons – the Sugar Bowl vs. Notre Dame (24-23 in 1973) and the Orange Bowl vs. Notre Dame (13-11 in 1974).

**FIVE STRAIGHT IN THE SEC:** Alabama recently won five straight Southeastern Conference games without a bye for just the second time this decade. Alabama also won five straight SEC games without a bye in 2002. What makes this feat even more impressive is that the Crimson Tide is the only SEC team this decade to do it once, much less twice. In 2002, UA rolled off five straight wins without a bye week against Mississippi, Tennessee, Vanderbilt, Mississippi and LSU. In 2009, the Tide beat Arkansas, Kentucky, Mississippi, South Carolina and Tennessee.

**ALABAMA 26-1 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF:** Before trailing LSU at halftime, 7-3, on Nov. 7, Alabama had led at the half of seven consecutive games. The Crimson Tide is 26-1 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban, including a 20-game winning streak. The only loss came against LSU in 2007 when UA held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing, 41-34, on Nov. 3, 2007, at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide is 2-5 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 1-2 when tied at halftime. The two wins when trailing at the half came in a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech on Sept. 5 in Atlanta and a 24-15 victory over No. 9 LSU on Nov. 7. Alabama's lone win when tied at halftime came last year at LSU, a 27-21 victory over Nov. 8, 2008.

**BEST COACHING STARTS:** Nick Saban has compiled a 29-8 (.784) record in his career with the Tide and the 29 wins rank as the fourth-most for any Crimson Tide head football coach after 37 games. Wallace Wade holds the record for most wins after 37 games with 33 victories. Frank Thomas is second with 32 wins while Gene Stallings is third with 31. Xen Scott is fifth with 26 and Paul "Bear" Bryant is sixth with 25 wins at this point in their careers. Below are the most wins by UA coaches after the first 37 and 38 career games.

**TIDE CAPTURES 800TH WIN:** The storied Alabama football program captured the program's 800th win on Sept. 5 in Atlanta with a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech. Alabama is the seventh school in the Football Bowl Subdivision to reach the 800-win plateau. The Crimson Tide holds an 809-316-43 all-time record for a .711 winning percentage that ranks sixth in FBS history. The other six programs to record 800 wins: Michigan (877); Texas (841); Notre Dame (836); Nebraska (823); Ohio State (816); Penn State (808).

**18 NATIONAL TV GAMES IN LAST TWO YEARS:** The Auburn game in two weeks, which will be broadcast on CBS, will be the Crimson Tide's 18th national television game since the start of the 2008 season. UA opened the season with a national ABC broadcast against Virginia Tech and CBS then broadcast the Arkansas, Mississippi, Tennessee and LSU games. ESPN broadcast the Tide's win over South Carolina in Bryant-Denny Stadium and UA's Nov. 14 win at Mississippi State. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games broadcast nationally, including five games on CBS, three games on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX. The 10 nationally broadcast games last year were tied with Notre Dame for the most in the nation.

**FIRST-TIME STARTERS:** Sixteen Alabama players (10 on offense, 6 on defense) have made their first career starts for the Crimson Tide this season. On defense, senior linebacker Eryk Anders, sophomore defensive back Mark Barron and sophomore defensive lineman Marcell Dareus were first-time starters against Virginia Tech before sophomore free safety Robby Green made his first career start as the Tide employed five defensive backs on the first play of scrimmage against FIU and Courtney Upshaw got his first start at Kentucky. True freshman Nico Johnson made his first start at will linebacker against South Carolina. On offense, junior left tackle James Carpenter, sophomore center William Vlachos, sophomore right guard Barrett Jones, senior tight end Colin Peek, sophomore tight end/H-back Brad Smelley and junior quarterback Greg McElroy made their first starts against Tech. Against FIU, senior running back Roy Upchurch made his first start for the Crimson Tide. Darius Hanks started his first game vs. North Texas and tight end Michael Williams got his first start vs. LSU.

**NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw four players selected in the 2009 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Andre Smith, who went to the Cincinnati Bengals with the No. 6 overall pick. Glen Coffee (San Francisco), Antoine Caldwell (Houston) and Rashad Johnson (Arizona) all went off the board in the third round. The four picks were the most for the Tide since five players were taken in 2005.

**RETURNING SUCCESS:** Much of the talk in the preseason was about Alabama's vaunted defense, and the defensive side of the football is where the Crimson Tide returned the biggest portion of its players from last year's Sugar Bowl team. UA features 15 total returning starters and 55 lettermen this season, but eight of those returning starters are on the defensive side of the football with four on offense and both specialists. The Tide returned 90 percent of its lettermen on defense and 73 percent on offense. The defense returns 84 percent of the tackles (728 of 866) from 2008. The special teams returned almost completely intact with place-kicker Leigh Tiffin, punter P.J. Fitzgerald, snapper Brian Selman and return specialist Javier Arenas.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS:** The Crimson Tide had five players earn preseason first-team All-America honors prior to the 2009 campaign. Javier Arenas, Terrence Cody, Mike Johnson, Julio Jones and Rolando McClain have garnered at least one first-team designation. McClain leads the way with six first-team honors.

**ALABAMA'S TV RECORD:** Alabama has compiled a 186-115-5 (.616) all-time record in 306 televised games. This does not include pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts. The Crimson Tide owns a 161-96-3 (.625) record in 260 regular-season televised games.

**OVERTIME RECORD:** Alabama is 4-7 (.364) all-time in overtime games. In its last overtime game, the Crimson Tide defeated LSU, 27-21, at Tiger Stadium on Nov. 8, 2008. Alabama has lost six of its last nine overtime games. The Crimson Tide is 4-6 (.400) in overtime games against SEC teams. Alabama is 2-4 (.333) in overtime home games. The Crimson Tide is 3-4 (.429) in single-overtime games.

**NICK'S KIDS:** At Michigan State, head coach Nick Saban and his wife Terry started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans have continued in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise over \$1 million - including over \$300,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 160 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

**STADIUM RENOVATION:** The newest expansion project for Bryant-Denny Stadium will see an increase in seating capacity to approximately 101,000, keeping it among the largest on-campus football stadiums in the nation. The expansion, which is expected to be complete for the beginning of the 2010 season, will be the fourth expansion of this magnificent edifice since 1988 and the seventh expansion in the stadium's history. This renovation will mirror north end zone project that was completed in 2006. It will consist of roughly 8,500 additional

seats, 1,700 South Zone Club seats, two corner video boards, an upper concourse with concessions and restrooms, 36 skyboxes, offices Donors Hall of Fame and an outdoor market for food and merchandise.

**NEW HIRES:** The Alabama football staff features two new faces in 2009, including linebackers' coaches Sal Sunseri and James Willis. Sunseri joins the staff spending the last seven seasons as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Carolina Panthers where he coached the likes of Pro Bowl players Julius Peppers, Mike Rucker and Kris Jenkins. Willis joined Saban's staff after spending three years with Auburn where he worked with former Saban assistant Will Muschamp. He spent seven seasons in the NFL prior to beginning his coaching career.

**TOP AIDES:** Alabama's coaching staff has a wealth of knowledge across all levels of football. The nine-man Crimson Tide staff features a former head coach at the Bowl Subdivision level in Bobby Williams (Michigan State). The staff also has six coaches that have spent time as assistant coaches in the NFL in Bo Davis (Dolphins), Jim McElwain (Raiders), Joe Pendry (19 years with multiple teams), Kirby Smart (Dolphins), Sal Sunseri (Panthers) and Bobby Williams (Lions and Dolphins). Alabama's coaching staff boasts 40-plus years of combined NFL coaching experience.

**THREE TIDE PLAYERS NAMED PLAYBOY ALL-AMERICANS:** Alabama landed three players on the 2009 *Playboy Magazine* annual preseason College Football All-America Team. Rolando McClain was selected as a linebacker while Julio Jones was picked at wide receiver and Javier Arenas was the return specialist. Alabama has now had four *Playboy All-Americans* in the last two years after Andre Smith was chosen in 2008.

**BURNS AND COCHRAN HONORED:** Associate head coach and running backs coach Burton Burns along with head strength and conditioning coach Scott Cochran were named the nation's best at their respective fields in 2008. Burns was named college football's 2008 FootballScoop Running Backs Coach of the Year, while Cochran was tabbed as the 2008 Samson Strength & Conditioning Coach of the Year for his work with the Crimson Tide in the weight room.

**CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS:** The Alabama football program was well represented throughout the NFL with the opening of the 2009 season with former players and coaches dotting league rosters. The Tide has 36 former players and coaches working in the NFL this season. The Crimson Tide is also represented on 17 of the league's 30 teams. Four former Alabama players and coaches are with the defending Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers, including defensive back DeShea Townsend and assistant coaches John Mitchell (assistant head coach/DL), Bruce Arians (offensive coordinator/QBs) and Amos Jones (special teams). The Crimson Tide has 21 current NFL players, including 18 on active rosters and two more on practice squads or injured reserve. There are 13 former UA players and/or coaches serving as assistant coaches in the NFL this season, including Sylvester Croom (St. Louis), Freddie Kitchens (Arizona) and Richard Williamson (Carolina).

**A-DAY SUCCESS:** Alabama has led the SEC in spring football game attendance each of the last three seasons, averaging 84,769 fans for Coach Nick Saban's three A-Day football games at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama dew a then-NCAA record 92,138 fans for Saban's first spring football game on April 21, 2007. In 2008, Alabama led the SEC again with 78,200 fans for it's A-Day game on April 12. The Tide again set the pace in the SEC with 84,050 fans on April 17, 2009.

## CRIMSON TIDE OPPONENT NOTES

**ALABAMA-CHATTANOOGA SERIES:** Alabama has won all 10 meetings with the Chattanooga, in a series that dates back to the 1908 season. Alabama won that inaugural meeting 23-6 on Oct. 31, 1908. The Crimson Tide notched four straight shutout wins over the Mocs in 1914 (63-0), 1929 (46-0), 1931 (39-0) and 1950 (27-0). Alabama's 46-0 win over Chattanooga on Oct. 12, 1929, was the third game ever played at the Tide's present day home stadium. The Mocs were also coached that day by Harold "Red" Drew, who later served as Alabama's head coach from 1947-54. Drew compiled a 13-5-2 record in 1929-30 at Chattanooga. He was 54-28-7 in his tenure with the Crimson Tide. Drew was also the head coach at Birmingham Southern (1924-28) and Mississippi (1946). Drew is one of three former Alabama players or coaches to coach at Chattanooga. Frank Thomas, who led Alabama to a 146-115-24 record and two national championships from 1931-46, also coached the Mocs from 1925-28 and compiled a 26-9-2 record in four seasons. Drew and Thomas led the Mocs to three consecutive Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association (SIAA) championships in 1927, 1928 and 1929. Another former UA player and assistant coach Bill Oliver was the head coach at Chattanooga from 1980-83, where he compiled a 29-14-1 record. Oliver played on Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's 1961 national championship squad and then later served as an assistant at Alabama under Bryant and Gene Stallings, winning a national championship in each term. Thomas, Drew and Oliver are the three winningest coaches in Chattanooga history, in terms of winning percentage. In addition, Thomas is among seven coaches who have coached for and against Alabama in their careers. The complete list includes Eli Abbott, Paul "Bear" Bryant, Bill Curry, "Red" Drew, G.H. Harvey, Nick Saban and Stallings. The 1950 game was the first game in the series to be played at Birmingham's Legion Field. The Tide posted a 42-28 win in 1952 and a 21-14 victory in 1953. The Tide added another shutout with the win in 1959. The two teams have met only twice since the last Tuscaloosa meeting, with both games taking place at Legion Field in 1991 and 1994. The Crimson Tide posted a 53-7 win over Chattanooga at Legion Field on Oct. 5, 1991. The Chattanooga roster that day featured wide receiver and Alabama native Terrell Owens, who caught one pass for seven yards in the loss. The last meeting between the two schools took place during the 1994 season as the Tide posted a 42-13 win to open the season on Sept. 3 at Legion Field.

**50 YEARS LATER:** It has been 50 years since Alabama and Chattanooga played against each other in Tuscaloosa. That streak ends today as the Crimson Tide closes out its 2009 home schedule with its first game against the Mocs at Bryant-Denny Stadium since Oct. 10, 1959. Alabama won that game, 13-0, behind a stern defensive performance and a pair of rushing touchdowns from quarterbacks Pat Trammell and Bobby Skelton. The rugged Alabama defense did not allow the Mocs to move the ball past their own 42-yard line in the first half and the Tide's 46-yard line in the second half. Chattanooga managed only 81 rushing yards and did not complete a pass in seven attempts against the UA defense. Skelton scored the first touchdown in the opening quarter on a sparkling 18-yard run. Trammell accounted for the other touchdown as he raced 54 yards to pay dirt in the third quarter. Penalties killed several other Tide scoring chances and one infraction nullified a 42-yard touchdown pass from Skelton to halfback Duff Morrison.

- Saban brings a 120-50-1 (.705) record as a college head coach into his third season in Tuscaloosa. He has three conference championships and nine teams have played in post-season bowl games, including a trip to the Allstate Sugar Bowl last season.

- Saban one of two (Bob Stoops, Oklahoma) current Football Bowl Subdivision coach to coach for at least 10 years and not suffer a losing season. In 2008, Saban produced the largest win increase from year one to year two in school history as Alabama went from seven wins in 2007 to 12 wins in 2008. He also garnered six national coach of the year awards last year, including the Home Depot Coach of the year, the FWAA/Eddie Robinson, Associated Press, Sporting News, Walter Camp and Liberty Mutual. Saban also spent a little time behind the camera during the offseason. He flew to Los Angeles and film an ESPN College GameDay commercial with Kirk Herbstreit and Chris Fowler. Saban also filmed scenes for the movie *Blindside*, which chronicles the life of former Mississippi offensive tackle Michael Oher.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen.

- Saban also is a published author. He co-authored "Tiger Turnaround" in 2001, a book documenting his first two years as head coach at LSU, and co-authored "How Good Do You Want to Be" in 2005, a book that offers real-life principles for success at work and at home.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$1 million - including more than \$300,000 this year - for "Nick's Kids" and made a total of more than 160 donations to children's charities throughout the state of Alabama.

- Saban and his wife, Terry, supported several charitable and civic projects in Louisiana. The largest of those efforts was with the Children's Miracle Network, for which Terry and Nick raised more than \$100,000 a year for children.

- Saban was on the cover of the Sept. 1 issue of *Forbes* magazine. The article, written by Monte Burke, examines Saban and his guidance of Crimson Tide program. The cover features Saban with Bryant-Denny Stadium in the background. Saban is the first college football coach to be featured on the cover of *Forbes* since the publication began in 1917.

- The Saban's pledged \$1 million to the University for scholarships in June of 2008. The Saban scholarships are designed specifically for first-generation college students. Six first-generation college students have already benefitted from the \$100,000 gift the Saban's made upon their arrival at the Capstone in January 2007.

## HISTORY OF ALABAMA FOOTBALL

- The University of Alabama is in its 115th football season and has compiled an 809-316-43 (.711) all-time record in 1,168 games.
- Alabama won its 800th game on Sept. 5, 2009, with a 34-24 win over No. 7 Virginia Tech in the Chick-fil-A College Kickoff at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. The Tide is the seventh program in Football Bowl Subdivision history to win 800 games.
- The Crimson Tide played its first football game on Nov. 11, 1892, with a 56-0 win over Birmingham High School in Birmingham.
- Alabama is tied for fifth among Division I schools in terms of all-time wins.
- The Crimson Tide football legacy includes 12 national championships, 21 SEC championships and 92 All-Americans.
- UA also ranks among the best in post-season play, holding the NCAA record for most bowl games (56) and most bowl wins (31).
- Alabama ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 30 10-win seasons. Alabama's enduring success on the gridiron is further reflected in the fact that the Crimson Tide has recorded seasons with 10 or more wins in nine different decades since the first double-digit win season in 1920 (10-1).
- Alabama has compiled a 354-159-20 (.683) record in 533 SEC games since 1933.
- Alabama has played in more SEC games (533), has more wins (354) and has won more league titles (21) than any team in SEC history. The Tide also has more SEC wins than Kentucky, Vanderbilt, Arkansas and South Carolina combined.
- Alabama is the only SEC school to win a championship in every decade since the 1930s. The Crimson Tide's last SEC Championship came in 1999.
- Alabama became the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in a decade in the 1970s. The Crimson Tide posted a 103-16-1 (.863) record from 1970-79, which included eight SEC Championships and three national titles.

## BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM

- Alabama's on-campus home since 1929, Bryant-Denny Stadium is one of college football's most scenic venues.
- The Crimson Tide has compiled an all-time record of 224-46-3 (.826) in 273 games at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- The stadium was originally named for former University of Alabama President Dr. George H. Denny. Dr. Denny was named UA President on Jan. 1, 1912 and amassed an extraordinary career that spanned almost a quarter of a century.
- Bryant-Denny Stadium and Denny Chimes (located on the UA quadrangle) stand as reminders of Denny's legacy to the Capstone.
- In 1976, the State of Alabama Legislature and the UA Board of Trustees added coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's name to the stadium, thus calling Alabama's football home Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- Alabama's Sept. 2, 2006 season opener against Hawai'i drew a state-record 92,138 fans. The previous Bryant-Denny Stadium record was 86,869 on October 23, 1999, against Tennessee.

## ALL-TIME TUSCALOOSA RECORD

- In addition to its impressive record at Bryant-Denny Stadium (1929-present), Alabama has made Tuscaloosa a very difficult place to play for opposing football teams.
- Alabama has compiled a 309-59-3 (.837) record in 371 games in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide captured their 300th win in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 18, 2008, vs. Mississippi.
- Alabama's first game on campus was a 4-0 loss to Birmingham Athletic Club on Oct. 14, 1893.
- From 1911-28, Alabama posted a 55-2 (.965) record in Tuscaloosa. The 1929 season marked the opening of what is now known as Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant posted a remarkable 72-2 (.973) record in Tuscaloosa, losing only to Florida (1963) and Southern Miss (1982). The USM game was the last game Bryant coached at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
- From 1963-82, Alabama posted an NCAA record 57-game home winning streak.
- Miami has since broken that record with a 58-game home winning streak, but the Hurricanes' record also includes three wins in the post-season Orange Bowl game. All of UA's 57 wins were in the regular season.
- The 57-game winning streak is one of seven winning streaks longer than 15 games for the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa.
- Alabama posted a 19-game unbeaten streak in Tuscaloosa from 1928-35.
- The Crimson Tide currently have a 13-game winning streak at Bryant-Denny Stadium.
