THE GAME: The No. 3/3 University of Alabama football team travels to Arlington, Texas, for its season opener with No. 20/18 Wisconsin in the AdvoCare Classic on Saturday, Sept. 5. The neutral site matchup inside AT&T Stadium between the Crimson Tide and Badgers is scheduled for a 7 p.m. CT kickoff on ABC. Chris Fowler will serve as the play-by-play announcer with Kirk Herbstreit at his side as the color analyst. The pair will be joined by sideline reporter Heather Cox. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter. ESPN Radio will carry the game as well, with Bill Rosinski, David Norrie and Joe Schad on the call.

PRESEASON RANKINGS: Alabama opens the 2015 campaign ranked third in both the Associated Press Preseason Poll and the Amway Coaches Poll. Wisconsin begins the season as the No. 20 team in the AP Poll and the 18th-ranked squad in Amway Coaches Poll.

WISCONSIN: The Badgers are coming off an 11-3 year that ended with a 34-31 victory over Auburn in Outback Bowl on New Year's Day. Wisconsin wrapped up the regular season 10-2 overall and 7-1 during Big Ten play to earn a spot in the conference championship game. The Badgers are directed by first-year head coach Paul Chryst, who comes to UW after three seasons at Pitt that saw the Panthers go 19-19 over that time. Wisconsin enters 2015 returning 11 starters and 44 lettermen from a season ago.

SERIES HISTORY: Alabama and Wisconsin will meet for just the second time in the history of the two storied programs. The lone matchup between the Crimson Tide and Badgers came in 1928 with Wisconsin claiming a 15-0 win in Madison.

DOMES OPENERS: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has played in five season-opening games inside a domed stadium. In those five contests, the Crimson Tide is a perfect 5-0 and owns a 177-81 scoring advantage over its opponents. Alabama has played one of those season openers inside AT&T Stadium, a 41-14 win over then-No. 8 Michigan to begin the 2012 slate.

NEXT GAME: Alabama will open its home schedule against Middle Tennessee State on Sept. 12 on the SEC Network with a 3 p.m. CT kickoff inside Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide and Blue Raiders have met just twice all-time, with Alabama claiming victories in both contests. In the most recent meeting, the Tide recorded a 26-7 victory to start the 2005 season.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY: Alabama will be making its 33rd (20-12 record) appearance on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show broadcasts from Fort Worth for Saturday's season opener between the Crimson Tide and Badgers. It will mark Alabama's 24th appearance under head coach Nick Saban (17-6). The 24 appearances in the Saban era are four better than Oregon for the most GameDay appearances since the 2007 season. The Crimson Tide was on four times in 2008 against Clemson, Georgia, LSU and Florida. The Tide then made three appearances during the 2009 season against Virginia Tech and Florida in Atlanta and Texas at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif. UA hosted GameDay in Tuscaloosa on Sept. 11, 2010, and made another showing four weeks later at South Carolina. In 2011, the Tide was featured on the show three times including twice against LSU (Nov. 5 in Tuscaloosa and Jan. 9 in New Orleans) and once at Auburn in the Iron Bowl (Nov. 26). In 2012, the show opened in Arlington, Texas, for Alabama's game vs. Michigan (Sept. 1) and also appeared at LSU (Nov. 3), the SEC Championship game vs. Georgia (Dec. 1) and the BCS National Championship game against Notre Dame (Jan. 7). UA was 2-1 in 2013 with wins at Texas A&M and against LSU with a loss at Auburn. GameDay visited Tuscaloosa twice and featured the Crimson Tide three times overall in 2014. In those contests, Alabama owned a 2-1 record that included wins at home over top-ranked Mississippi State and No. 15 Auburn and a 23-17 loss at Ole Miss.

NEUTRAL SITES: Alabama is 76-48-4 (.609) in neutral site contests. The list includes all Alabama-Auburn games not played on campus, including Legion Field from 1948-88. The Crimson Tide played three neutral site games last season, opening the year with a 33-23 win over West Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta. In the postseason, UA claimed an SEC Championship with its 42-13 win over Missouri in Atlanta, and then ended the year with a 42-35 loss to Ohio State in the Sugar Bowl. The Crimson Tide is 11-4 in neutral site games during head coach Nick Saban's tenure at Alabama.

DOMES SWEET DOME: The Crimson Tide is 17-7-1 (.700) in domed stadiums, including a 8-2 mark since 2009 and 9-4 in Coach Saban's tenure. The Tide had three appearances in domes last season, including the season opener against West Virginia and the SEC Championship versus Missouri - both of which were in Atlanta - and the season finale against Ohio State in the Allstate Sugar Bowl inside the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans.

FACING OFF WITH THE BEST: The Crimson Tide has the toughest schedule in college football this season per ESPN.com's College Football Power Index. Southeastern Conference teams represent 13 of the top-25 toughest schedules in college football, per that same index. Alabama will face off with 10 teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago, joining just three other teams in the nation to face the same gauntlet (also, Arkansas, Vanderbilt, Virginia). Just 14 total teams will square off with at least nine opponents who went bowling a season ago.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in just three total regular season games without national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications in the past seven years.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 84 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013 and 12-2 in 2014. Boise State is second with 81 wins while Oregon is third with 80 victories.

CONSISTENTLY TOP 10: Alabama has cemented itself amongst the top 10 teams in the Associated Press Poll over the last four seasons. Entering 2015, the Crimson Tide have appeared in the AP top 10 every single week since the final poll of the 2010 season, where UA finished 10th. The Tide has appeared in the top 10 for 67 consecutive weeks, the longest active streak and seventh-longest streak in the history of the poll.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 31-11 (.738) against the Associated Press top 25, including a 17-6 (.739) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. This season, the Tide will face off against seven teams in the AP preseason poll, the most ranked opposition of any team in the nation. Alabama finished 5-2 in 2014 against the AP top 25 after going 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 against the AP top 25 in 2010.

10-WIN SEASONS: With last season's 48-14 victory over Western Carolina, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the seventh consecutive season. The seven straight years with 10 wins extends the school record that was set by the Tide in 2013. Prior to finishing that season with 11 wins, the previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 119 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 34 times, one back of Oklahoma (35) for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced nine 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2014). Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban is the 11th coach in school history to lead his team to a 10-win season and is the fifth coach in school history to have more than one 10-win season. Bryant had a school-record 12 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with seven. Other coaches to reach the milestone include Gene Stallings (4), Wallace Wade (2), Frank Thomas (2),

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 728 of the 1,090 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 441-126-8 (.774) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including an 83-14 (.857) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 116th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started four seasons at No. 1 (2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 25 seasons (1991-2015), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011 and 2012 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and four USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011 & 2012) coaches poll national titles.

SEC RECORD: Alabama broke its tie with the Florida teams of 1993 through 1998 for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history when it defeated Western Carolina on Nov. 22 of last season to improve to 10-1 for the 2014 campaign. Alabama had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012 and 11-2 in 2013.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former UA players selected in the 2015 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Amari Cooper who went fourth overall to the Oakland Raiders, the Tide's highest selection since Trent Richardson went third overall in 2012. Safety Landon Collins was the next to go (33rd, New York Giants) followed by T.J. Yeldon (36th, Jacksonville Jaguars) with both players being selected in the second round. Versatile back Jalston Fowler followed Yeldon, being selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the Tennessee Titans. Also going in the fourth round was offensive lineman Arie Kouandjio who went 112th overall to the Washington Redskins. The Tide's final pair of draft picks came in the seventh round, with offensive lineman Austin Shepherd going to the Minnesota Vikings at pick 228 and linebacker Xzavier Dickson going at pick 253 to the Super Bowl Champion New England Patriots.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last five years (37) than any other college in the nation. Fourteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 19 have gone in the first two rounds of the NFL Draft. The list of 37 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 12 starters and 54 letterwinners from its 2014 squad that finished 12-2 as the SEC Western Division and SEC Champions. The 2015 team returns seven starters on a veteran defense including Jonathan Allen, Denzel Devall, Eddie Jackson, Cyrus Jones, Reggie Ragland, Jarran Reed and A'Shawn Robinson. The offense welcomes back the staples of its offensive line in center Ryan Kelly and left tackle Cam Robinson.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past eight seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2015 squad features four players who already have degrees in hand before the opening kick of the Wisconsin game. Over the past eight seasons (2008-present) Alabama has seen **94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate)** by players still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after already having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive **11 players earn a Master's degree** before stepping foot on the field.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Crimson Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the highlights of the Tide's academic successes under head coach Nick Saban.

- An NCAA-leading seven members of the SEC Championship team that participated in the 2015 College Football Playoff Semifinal game had already earned a Master's degree.
- For the second consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).
- Alabama's last three national title football teams included 60 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS National Championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That same team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the 2011 SEC Academic Honor Roll

- The 2009 BCS National Championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- Alabama has led the Southeastern Conference in number of football student-athletes being named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

KELLY'S CLASSROOM SUCCESS: Senior Ryan Kelly has been a staple on the Crimson Tide offensive line for each of his four seasons in Tuscaloosa, but just as impressive are his academic talents. The Tide center graduated last summer with his undergraduate degree in marketing and is currently enrolled in classes working towards his Master's degree in the same specialization, which he is scheduled to receive this December. During his undergraduate career he was named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll three times, the SEC Freshman Honor Roll and the Dean's list in both semesters of 2013. Kelly currently holds a 3.75 grade point average in his graduate studies.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: What Alabama football does off the field is equally as important as their successes on the field. Last season alone, the Crimson Tide put in 200-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals and on campus.

RAGLAND PUTTING IN WORK: Senior linebacker Reggie Ragland has dedicated himself to volunteering in the community each of his four seasons, contributing numerous service hours each season. Across his first three years in Tuscaloosa, Ragland put together an impressive list of volunteering opportunities and has gone above and beyond what is asked of Alabama football student-athletes. In all, he has totaled more than 50 hours of community service across double-digit volunteer opportunities that include visits to hospitals, schools and churches. Ragland has also visited veterans numerous times at local VA hospitals.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won nine national championships in five different sports and 20 SEC Championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2014-15 academic year - football and gymnastics.
- The overall cumulative grade point average of UA student-athletes in 2014-15 was 3.031.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2014-15.
- 114 Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status last year, a total made up of 48 in the Fall of 2014 and 66 in the Winter of 2015.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 102 Academic All-America honors, which ranks third nationally over that span behind only Nebraska (127) and Notre Dame (120). Alabama passed Penn State in 2014-15 (94) with Stanford rounding out the top five at 92.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

VETERAN DEFENSE: The Alabama defense looks to be one the team's strong suits in 2015, returning seven starters from a season ago. Those seven return 330 total tackles, 40 tackles for loss and nine sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, five come from the Tide front seven, including Jonathan Allen who collected 11.5 tackles for a combined loss of 44 yards, both totals that ranked second on the team in 2014. Senior defensive leader and inside linebacker Reggie Ragland returns as well after recording 95 total tackles, 10.5 of which were for a loss, to rank second on last year's team in tackles and third in tackles for loss.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST BAMA: Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense, led by coordinator Kirby Smart and head coach Nick Saban, has surrendered just 118 touchdowns over the last 80 games. That is 35 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 153).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: In head coach Nick Saban's 108-game tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 66 times, or 61.1 percent of the time. UA held six of 14 opponents below 300 yards in 2014. **HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200:** During head coach Nick Saban's last 94 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 32 times, most recently against Texas A&M on Oct. 18, 2014, which was the second time the Tide accomplished the feat in 2014 after doing it four times in 2013. In 2012, Alabama did so five times, and in 2011, the Tide accomplished the feat eight times, limiting Kent State to 90 yards and LSU to only 92 yards in the BCS Championship Game (the second and third times a Saban defense has limited its opponent to less than 100 yards of total offense). Alabama's best came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense. UA held opponents under 200 yards three times in 2010, four times in 2009 and six times in 2008.

10 POINTS OR FEWER: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or fewer 51 times since the start of the 2007 season, with its most recent against Texas A&M on Oct. 18, 2014. The Tide's shutout of Texas A&M was the second shutout of the season. Alabama held 9-of-13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents in the 0-10 point range in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. UA kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009, and in 2007 posted two games in which it held opponents to 0-10 points. Alabama has shut out the opposition 15 times during the Saban era.

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama allowed only five rushing touchdowns in 14 games in 2014, which was the fewest in the nation (UCF was second with nine). The Tide lead the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 73. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 55 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 86 since 2007.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Limiting opposing running backs to fewer than 100 yards is nothing new for the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 15 individual 100-yard rushing games dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that leads the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival, the Tide has allowed only 10 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliot (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss's BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

RAGLAND LEADING THE TIDE D AT LINEBACKER: Reggie Ragland stepped up in 2014 at will linebacker for the Crimson Tide. Ragland was second on the team with 95 total tackles while accounting for 10.5 tackles for loss (-27 yards), 1.5 sacks (-12 yards), one interception, three pass breakups, three fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and a quarterback hurry. His season highlights included a 13-tackle performance, with four solos and one for loss, at LSU, and 10 stops against No. 1 Mississippi State.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

FIRST HALF POINTS: Alabama has scored in the first half of the last 103 games it has played, which is the longest streak in the nation. The last time the Tide failed to score in the first half was Sept. 29, 2007, when Alabama and Florida State headed into halftime tied at 0-0. The Seminoles won the game 21-14. The Tide has scored in the first half of every game since. Alabama has an 88-15 record during the streak.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama is 69-3 since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, Ole Miss and Ohio State in 2014.

BALL PROTECTION: In its past 95 games, the Tide has turned the ball over only 110 times (63 fumbles, 47 interceptions) for 1.16 turnovers per game. Since 2009, that mark is even better as the Tide has turned the ball over only 91 times in 81 games (1.12/gm). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 34 interceptions in 2,159 attempts (1 INT every 63.5 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 16 times. Over that 95-game span, the Tide's top two running backs have recorded 2,350 touches, losing a fumble once every 146.9 touches.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: With Derrick Henry's 25-yard rush into the end zone on Alabama's third offensive drive of the Sugar Bowl, the Tide has scored in 183 consecutive games – the longest streak in program history.

HENRY TAKES THE LEAD: Junior running back Derrick Henry has excelled in two seasons as the backup, but will get the chance as the starter this season. The tailback has started just one game in his career, but returns 990 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns from a season ago - both team highs. For his career, Henry has amassed 1,372 yards, making him the 54th player in school history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark.

DRAKE RETURNS FOR THE TIDE: Senior tailback Kenyan Drake returns for his senior season after suffering a season-ending leg injury against Ole Miss a season ago. Prior to his setback, Drake had 22 carries for 112 yards to average 5.1 yards per carry, while adding four rushing touchdowns and six total scores. The explosive back also caught five passes for 149 yards to average 31.8 yards per catch with two receiving touchdowns. An explosive option in the running and passing game, Drake's last healthy season saw him put together 694 yards and eight touchdowns in just 11 games played as a sophomore in 2013.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

PUNTING PROWESS: JK Scott logged the first punt of his career, a 62-yard kick, which sailed to the 7-yard line to pin West Virginia deep in their own territory to start his freshman campaign in 2014. Scott proved to be nothing short of amazing in his first year, averaging 48.0 yards per punt to lead the nation. He also helped Alabama lead the nation in net punting at 44.67 yards per punt. Scott placed 26 of his 55 punts (56.4 percent) inside the 20, which was the best percentage nationally. The punter also had 23 boots of 50 yards or more last season with seven kicks of over 60 yards and two over 70 yards with a career long of 73.

INSIDE-THE-20: As mentioned above, JK Scott led the nation in percentage of punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He placed 31 of his 55 total punts (56.4 percent) inside the 20 with 12 inside the 10-yard line.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore Adam Griffith was 12-for-19 on field goal attempts in 2014, including four from 40-plus yards. In the season opener, Griffith began the season scoring by hitting one from 47 yards out in the opening quarter against West Virginia and another from 41 to give Alabama a 20-17 lead at the half. He also hit a 27-yarder in the third quarter and a 45-yarder in the fourth quarter, which resulted in the final score against the Mountaineers. Griffith then hit from 22 and 28 yards against Florida Atlantic and from 30 yards out vs. Southern Miss and 21 yards against Texas A&M. Griffith missed from 27 yards at LSU before hitting from 39 yards out and nailing the game-tying field goal with three seconds remaining in a come-from-behind win at No. 14 LSU. He hit from 36 and missed from 37 against No. 1 Mississippi State.

SERIES NOTES

ALABAMA-WISCONSIN SERIES: The Alabama Crimson Tide and Wisconsin Badgers will meet for just the second time in the history of the two storied programs when the teams square off on Saturday. The original matchup came in 1928, with the Badgers claiming a 15-0 shutout win in Madison. The 87-year gap between the last meeting and this season's contest is the largest time between Alabama and any of its opponents this season.

WISCONSIN CONNECTIONS: Alabama's secondary coach Mel Tucker represents the Crimson Tide's strongest connection to the University of Wisconsin. The first-year coach is a former member of the Badgers football team, lettering all four seasons as a defensive back in Madison. Burton Burns, Mario Cristobal and Bobby Williams all played in at least one game against the Badgers during their playing careers. Williams also faced off with Wisconsin as the head coach at Michigan State following Saban's departure, finishing with a 1-2 record against the Badgers.

SABAN VERSUS WISCONSIN: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 1-2 all-time against Wisconsin. All three contests game during Saban's time at Michigan State from 1995-99. The first matchup with the Badgers came in 1995, with the Spartans falling 45-14 inside Camp Randall Stadium. MSU bounced back with a 30-13 victory over the UW the very next season in East Lansing. The two teams did not face off again until Saban's final season in 1999, as Wisconsin came away with a 40-10 victory in Madison.

GENERAL NOTES

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 225-130-4 (.632) all-time record in 359 televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts).

This season UA was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. The Tide played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one game on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, UA played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

TIDE 84-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: The Crimson Tide is 84-6 when leading at halftime under head coach Nick Saban. They lost their most recent halftime lead (21-20) against Ohio State in the Sugar Bowl. Alabama had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide had also converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. The first two losses in the current run (when leading at the break) came against LSU, followed by a defeat to Auburn in 2010. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 3-7 under Saban when trailing at halftime and 3-3 when tied at halftime. The three wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; and 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010. And Alabama's three wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21) and against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6).

SEASON OPENERS: Alabama has compiled a 96-21-3 (.804) all-time record in season openers, and is in the midst of a 13-game winning streak. Dating back to the 1977 season, Alabama is 34-4 in its last 38 season opening contests and the Tide has posted a 21-2 opening day record since 1991. The 2015 season marks the 16th straight year that the Crimson Tide has opened the season with a non-conference opponent.

COACH SABAN IN SEASON OPENERS: Head coach Nick Saban is 16-3 in his collegiate career in season openers, including an 8-0 mark at Alabama. He led UA to a 52-6 win over Western Carolina on Sept. 1, 2007, in his inaugural game with the Crimson Tide. He followed that up with a 34-10 win over Clemson in 2008 and a 34-24 victory over Virginia Tech in 2009, with both games being played in Atlanta. In 2010, Saban guided Alabama to a 48-3 win over San Jose State and followed with a 48-7 victory over Kent State in 2011, both games being played inside Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide headed to Arlington, Texas, in 2012, downing then-No. 8 Michigan, 41-14, before returning to Atlanta the next two seasons. The 2013 season began with a 34-10 win over Virginia Tech and the Tide came home with a 33-23 victory against West Virginia to kick off last year. Saban won his very first collegiate game on Sept. 8, 1990, as he led Toledo to a 20-14 win over Miami (Ohio). He was 3-2 in season openers at Michigan State and 4-1 in season openers at LSU.

OPENING DAY SUCCESS UNDER SABAN: Alabama has been dominant in season openers under head coach Nick Saban. The Tide is a perfect 8-0 under Saban and has won in impressive fashion. Alabama has outscored its opponents 324-97 in those games and has outgained the opposition, 3,740-1,729. The Tide has averaged 40.5 points per opening contest under Saban and given up just 12.1 points per contest. UA has amassed 467.5 total yards per opener and surrendered just 216.1 yards per matchup.

SEASON OPENERS BY HEAD COACH: Coach Nick Saban currently stands at a perfect 8-0 in season openers during his tenure at the Capstone. Coach Frank Thomas (1931-46) set the Tide's standard for coaches on opening day, compiling a 13-0-2 record in his 15 seasons at Alabama. Legendary coach Paul W. "Bear" Bryant (1958-82) is the school's winningest coach in openers, logging 18 opening day wins across his 25-year career. Bryant's record in Alabama season openers was 18-6-1 (.740), including a six-game winning streak to close out his career.

SEASON OPENERS BY OPPONENT: The Crimson Tide will open the 2015 season with Wisconsin, marking the second meeting between the two teams in the storied history of both programs. Wisconsin will be the 60th different opening day opponent for Alabama. The Tide's most common opening day opponent is Howard (now Samford). UA has also played five current SEC teams on opening day, compiling a 14-8-1 (.630) record against Ole Miss, Georgia, Vanderbilt, Florida and LSU. The Tide has not opened the season against an SEC opponent since a 28-17 win at Vanderbilt in 1999.

SEASON OPENERS BY SITE: Alabama has played its season opener in 19 different cities in its football history. The most common venue for the Tide's season opener is on the UA campus in Tuscaloosa, where Alabama has opened its season 52 times and compiled a 49-2-1 record. The Tide is 19-1-1 in season opening games inside Bryant-Denny Stadium (circa 1929). UA opened the 2008, 2009, 2013 and 2014 seasons at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta and will head to Arlington, Texas, for a second time this season. The last time Alabama traveled to Cowboys Stadium was in 2012 when the Tide throttled then-No. 8 Michigan, 41-14.

ALABAMA VS. THE BIG TEN: Alabama has played in 37 games in program history against the current members of the Big Ten Conference and owns a 24-13 record all-time in those contests. The Crimson Tide has played 10 of the 14 members with Indiana, Iowa, Northwestern and Purdue being the only teams the Tide has not faced. UA owns the advantage in all series against Big Ten opponents except Minnesota and Saturday's opponent Wisconsin, with the Golden Gophers and Badgers each owning a 1-0 record against the Crimson Tide. Penn State has matched up with Alabama the most with the two teams meeting a total of 15 times. The Tide is 4-1 in its last five contests against the Big Ten, with the most recent loss to Ohio State ending a streak of four consecutive wins for UA.

SABAN VS. THE BIG TEN: Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban has a long history of facing off with the Big Ten over his career, playing in 49 games against the conference. Nearly all 49 of those games came during his time at Michigan State from 1995-99. For his career, Saban has compiled a 28-20-1 (.582) against Big Ten opposition. Since leaving the conference and MSU, Saban has faced Big Ten opponents a total of seven times, including twice at LSU where he first defeated Illinois, 47-34 in the 2002 Sugar Bowl and then losing to Iowa, 30-25, in the Capital One Bowl, his last game at LSU. During his time at Alabama, Saban has faced off with Big Ten opponents five times, first sweeping a home-and-home series with Penn State. The series against the Nittany Lions began first at home in Tuscaloosa in 2010 with the Tide claiming a 24-3 victory, and the series then wrapped up in State College with Alabama coming out on top, 27-11. He followed those victories up by dismantling his former employer, Michigan State, 49-7 in the Capital One Bowl on Jan. 1, 2011. Saban next faced off with Michigan in the season-opening Cowboy Classic in Arlington, Texas. The Crimson Tide came away with a decisive 41-14 victory over the Wolverines on the way to Alabama's 15th national championship. Most recently, the Tide fell 42-35 to Ohio State in the Allstate Sugar Bowl, the semifinal game of the first ever College Football Playoff.

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular-season games with 85. His 85 wins rank seventh in SEC history, five wins ahead of current Georgia head coach Mark Richt (80) on the league's list of conference wins. Each coach ahead of them on the list, except for South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier, is in the College Football Hall of Fame. Paul "Bear" Bryant tops the list with 159 conference wins at Kentucky (1946-53) and Alabama (1958-82). Spurrier is second with 131 league wins followed by John Vaught (Ole Miss, 106), Vince Dooley (Georgia, 105), Ralph "Shug" Jordan (Auburn, 98) and Phillip Fulmer (Tennessee, 98). Saban ranks second in league history in SEC regular-season winning percentage at .780 (85-24). He is fifth in league history in all-time winning percentage at .806 (133-32) and tied with Georgia's Mark Richt for 11th in career wins.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made two new additions to his 2015 staff during the offseason, hiring Tosh Lupoi to coach the outside linebackers and bringing in Mel Tucker to lead the secondary. Lupoi enters a full-time role after serving as an analyst a season ago. He has previous experience as an assistant coach at Washington and Cal, where he coached future first-rounders Danny Shelton, Cameron Jordan and Tyson Alualu. Tucker joins the Crimson Tide staff following a two-year stint as the defensive coordinator of the NFL's Chicago Bears. Tucker also served as defensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2009-12) and Cleveland Browns (2008). He originally linked up with Saban as a graduate assistant at Michigan State in 1997 and stayed in East Lansing for two years.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2015-16 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 55 former players (active or injured reserve) working for a spot on an NFL roster this season. In the last seven NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 48 players selected, including 17 players in first round, 11 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

He has four national championships – three at Alabama – six conference championships and 16 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships. He is the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and has won four titles in his last nine years coaching college football. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the fourth coach in the poll era to win four national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant, John McKay and Leahy).

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise approximately \$5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 15 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.
